- 2.3 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

7 Disclaimers

- 7.1 Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that Transnet reserves the right to:
 - modify the RFQ's goods / service(s) and request Respondents to re-bid on any changes;
 - reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
 - disqualify Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline;
 - not necessarily accept the lowest priced Quotation or an alternative bid;
 - place an order in connection with this Quotation at any time after the RFQ's closing date;
 - award only a portion of the proposed goods / services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ;

- split the award of the order/s between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- cancel the quotation process;
- validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is

9 Legal review

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

10 Security clearance

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the goods and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

11 National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Transnet is required to ensure that price quotations are invited and accepted from prospective bidders listed on the CSD. 12 Tax Compliance

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.



1.5 STEP FIVE: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

- Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market-related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:
 - o first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations fail,
 - o negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

1.6 STEP SIX: Objective Criteria (if applicable)

Transnet reserves the right to award the business to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder. The objective criteria Transnet may apply in this bid process include:

- Skills Transfer and Capacity Building for Transnet;
- Impact on Transnet's Return On Investment;
- Rotation of Suppliers to promote opportunities for other suppliers, by overlooking a supplier that has been awarded business repeatedly overtime in order to benefit other suppliers in the market;
- the tenderer:
- is not under restrictions, or has principals who are under restrictions, preventing participating in the employer's procurement,
- is not undergoing a process of being restricted by Transnet or other state institution that Transnet may be aware of,
- can, as necessary and in relation to the proposed contract, demonstrate that he or she possesses the
 professional and technical qualifications, professional and technical competence, financial resources,
 equipment and other physical facilities, managerial capability, reliability, experience and reputation,
 expertise and the personnel, to perform the contract,
- has the legal capacity to enter into the contract
- is not insolvent, in receivership, under Business Rescue as provided for in chapter 6 of the Companies Act, 2008, bankrupt or being wound up, has his affairs administered by a court or a judicial officer, has suspended his business activities, or is subject to legal proceedings in respect of any of the foregoing,
- complies with the legal requirements, if any, stated in the tender data and
- is able, in the option of the employer to perform the contract free of conflicts of interest.

1.7 STEP SEVEN: Award of business and conclusion of contract

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful or preferred bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Quotation by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s).
- Otherwise, a final contract will be concluded and entered into with the successful Bidder at the acceptance of a letter of award by the Respondent.

2 Validity Period

Transnet requires a validity period of 180 one hundred and eighty Business Days from the closing date of this RFQ, excluding the first day and including the last day.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. However, once the adjudication body has approved the process and award of the business to the successful bidder(s),

the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until a final contract has been concluded.

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2 Overview of the work

2.1 Executive Overview

Transnet Port Terminals is a division of Transnet SOC Limited whose core business is to provide cargo handling to a wide spectrum of customers, including shipping lines, freight forwarders and cargo owners. Operations are divided into five major business segments, namely containers, bulk, break bulk, automotive and national port authority.

Operations under DBT and MPT involve the use of conveyor belts systems for export, import and stacking of cargo. This process has been experiencing spillage problems which result in operational delays, damage to the organization infrastructure. The current influx of road trucks has increased a high risk of road transport operation, health, and environment because of cargo spillages.

The objective of this scope of work is to provide a fire watch service on conveyor belts within the terminal. The fire watchers will be responsible for monitoring and ensuring the prevention of fires during operations, and maintenance.

The purpose of this scope of work is to acquire a service provider to provide fire watchers for a period of one (1) month at Transnet Port Terminal Richards Bay, that will be based on as and when required basis.

2.2 Main Work Information

Provision of fire watchers' services contract for Transnet Port Terminals Richards Bay for one (1) month

The scope of work should cover mainly the following areas:

- a) Woodchips route.
- b) Coal route
- c) Sulphur routes
- d) Alumina & Petcoke routes
- e) General routes.

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2.3 Deliverables

- a) Adherence to TPT and TNPA policies and procedures.
- b) Use of appropriate and applicable PPE always.
- c) 100% staff compliment with supervisor present always with accordance to the shift pattern from 06H00 a.m. to 18H00p.m. and 18H00 p.m. to 06H00 a.m.
- d) Availability of all tools as per the scope of work requirement.
- e) Arrival to work on time (06H00 to 18H00 pm and 18H00 to 06H00)
- f) Conduct risk assessment prior commencement with any work as to identify associated risks
- g) Daily submission of attendance timesheets
- h) Provision of occurrence book for recording activities
- i) Submission of weekly and monthly reports identifying all high-risk areas.

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3 Detailed Scope of Work

3.1 Detailed Scope of Work

- 3.1.1 The fire watchers will be stationed at various key points along the conveyor belts.
- 3.1.2 Fire watchers will monitor conveyor belts and surrounding areas during and after any operational activities that present fire risk.
- 3.1.3 Fire watchers will be deployed on a 24-hour basis, following the terminal's operational schedules to provide uninterrupted coverage.
- 3.1.4 The team must be capable of responding to fire alarms and emergencies within a specified time frame of 5 minutes from the alert.
- 3.1.5 Fire watchers must undergo periodic training and participate in safety drills to stay prepared for different scenarios such as industrial fires, chemical spills or structural fires.
- 3.1.5 Fire watchers will have to identify fire hazards such as the accumulation of flammable materials, overheating of equipment, or malfunctioning systems along the conveyor belts.
- 3.1.6 In the event of a fire, fire watchers must initiate emergency procedures, control the fire, protect lives and property. Maintain continuous communication with operational teams to ensure that any potential risks are identified early.
- 3.1.7 Ensure compliance with all safety standards, including wearing appropriate PPE and following company safety protocols during fire watch duties.
- 3.1.8 After completion of any operation, especially high-risk operation, the fire watchers must continue monitoring for at least 30 minutes to ensure no residual fire risk remains.
- 3.1.9 Report any flammable materials that might be an ignition source of fire.
- 3.1.10 Maintain constant means of communication.
- 3.1.11 Fire watchers must be prepared to operate fire extinguishers, hydrants, fixed monitors and hose carts at any time.

5.1 Watching of Conveyor Belts

- Back Route (801)- 36 fire watchers
- 804 Route 36 fire watchers
- 4x supervisors
- 5.1.1 Bidders must note that the above requirement is indicative and may change at a point of intent, whereby as and when resource allocation may be concentrated where high demand of service is identified by Transnet.
- 5.1.2 Health and Safety is a critical elementary factor required on a mandatory basis when fire watching the conveyor belts because of the safety hazards associated with these systems.
- 5.1.3 Service providers to ensure that they never work under, below 1meter gap, and or unguarded running conveyor belt.
- 5.1.4 The service provider is required to report any conveyor belt systems running unguarded.

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- 5.1.5 A siren and yellow lights at any instance inside a conveyor belt gallery may signal that the belt system is about to run, and anyone in, on or within 1 meter of the system must withdraw themselves with their tools.
- 5.1.6 Safety precautions of working in conveyor belt systems must be taken very seriously.
