3.3 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

6 Changes to Quotations

Changes by the Respondent to its submission will not be considered after the closing date and time.

7 Binding Offer

Any Quotation furnished pursuant to this Request shall be deemed to be an offer. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

8 Disclaimers

8.1 Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- modify the RFQ's goods / service(s) and request Respondents to re-bid on any changes;

- reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein.
- disqualify Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline.
- not necessarily accept the lowest priced Quotation or an alternative bid.
- place an order in connection with this Quotation at any time after the RFQ's closing date.
- award only a portion of the proposed goods / services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ.
- split the award of the order/s between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations.
- cancel the quotation process.
- validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so.
- request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise.
- not accept any changes or purported changes by the Respondent to the bid rates after the closing date and/or after the award of the business, unless the contract specifically provides for it.
- to cancel the contract and/request that National Treasury place the Respondent on its Database of Restricted Suppliers for a period not exceeding 10 years, on the basis that a contract was awarded on the strength of incorrect information furnished by the Respondent or on any other basis recognised in law.
- award the business to the next ranked bidder, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Goods/Services at the quoted price, should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. 10 Legal review

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

11 Security clearance

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the goods and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

12 National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Transnet is required to ensure that price quotations are invited and accepted from prospective bidders listed on the CSD. Business may not be awarded to a respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD. The CSD can be accessed at <https://secure.csd.gov.za/>.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 Form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

13 Tax Compliance

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Respondents/ individuals who wish to submit bids.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

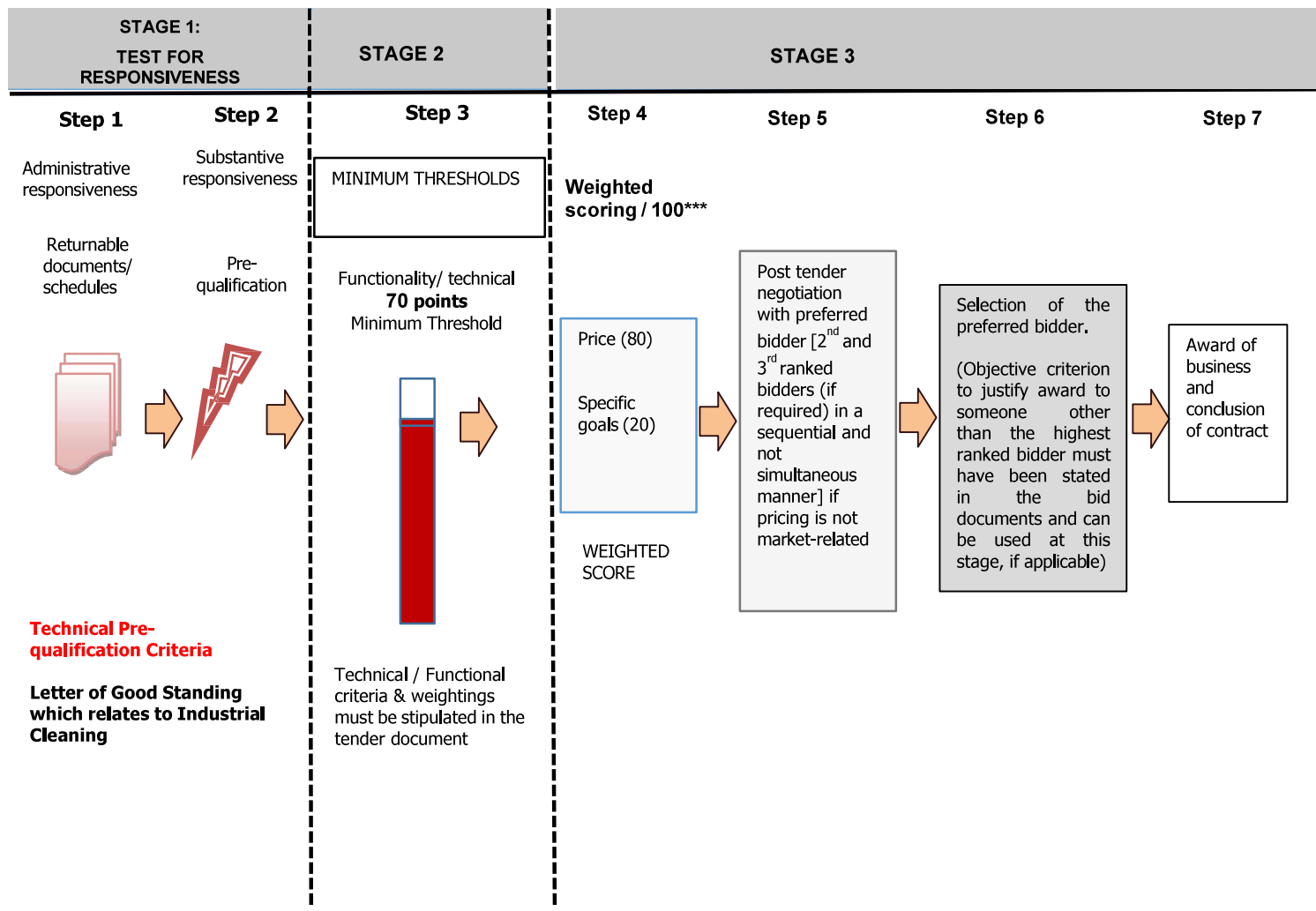

Respondents are to note that Transnet will round off final technical scores to the nearest 2 (two) decimal places for the purposes of determining whether the technical threshold has been met.

The minimum threshold for technical/functionality [Step Three] must be met or exceeded for a Respondent's Proposal to progress to Step Four for final evaluation.

1.4 STEP FOUR: Evaluation and Final Weighted Scoring

- Preference points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the specific goals requirements in accordance with the table indicated in Section 4.1 of the specific goals Claim Form.

1.5 STEP FIVE: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

- Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:
 - first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations fail,
 - negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

1.6 STEP SIX: Objective Criteria (if applicable)

Transnet reserves the right to award the business to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder. The objective criteria Transnet may apply in this bid process include:

- Skills Transfer and Capacity Building for Transnet.
- Impact on Transnet's Return on Investment.
- Rotation of Suppliers to promote opportunities for other suppliers, by overlooking a supplier that has been awarded business repeatedly overtime in order to benefit other suppliers in the market.
- the tenderer:
 - is not under restrictions, or has principals who are under restrictions, preventing participating in the employer's procurement,
 - is not undergoing a process of being restricted by Transnet or other state institution that Transnet may be aware of,
 - can, as necessary and in relation to the proposed contract, demonstrate that he or she possesses the professional and technical qualifications, professional and technical competence, financial resources, equipment and other physical facilities, managerial capability, reliability, experience and reputation, expertise and the personnel, to perform the contract,
 - has the legal capacity to enter into the contract
 - is not insolvent, in receivership, under Business Rescue as provided for in chapter 6 of the Companies Act, 2008, bankrupt or being wound up, has his affairs administered by a court or a judicial officer, has suspended his business activities, or is subject to legal proceedings in respect of any of the foregoing,
 - complies with the legal requirements, if any, stated in the tender data and

- is able, in the option of the employer to perform the contract free of conflicts of interest.
- all Risks identified during a risk assessment exercise/probity check (which may be conducted by an authorised third party) that would be done to assess all risks, including but not limited to:
- the financial stability of the bidder based on key ratio analysis, which would include, but not be limited to Efficiency, Profitability, Financial Risk, Liquidity, Acid Test, and Solvency.
- a due diligence to assess functional capability and capacity. This could include a site visit.
- A commercial relationship with a Domestic Prominent Influential Person (DPIP) or Foreign Prominent Public Official (FPPO) or an entity of which such person or official is the beneficial owner; and
- Reputational and Brand risks

1.7 STEP SEVEN: Award of business and conclusion of contract

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful or preferred bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Quotation by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s).
- Otherwise, a final contract will be concluded and entered into with the successful Bidder at the acceptance of a letter of award by the Respondent.

2 Validity Period

Transnet requires a validity period of 180 [one hundred and eighty] Business Days from the closing date of this RFQ, excluding the first day and including the last day.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. 2 Overview of the work

2.1 Executive Overview

Transnet Port Terminals is a division of Transnet SOC Limited whose core business is to provide cargo handling to a wide spectrum of customers, including shipping lines, freight forwarders and cargo owners. Operations are divided into five major business segments, namely containers, bulk, break bulk, automotive and national port authority.

The PRT operations focus on the efficient offloading of magnetite. The operation is designed to handle a minimum of 5 trains per day, each train consists of approximately 80 wagons, and all 80 wagons need to be de-tarped before the train can be pushed to the tippler or back actor for offloading. The delays in the de-tarping process result in the long dwelling time of wagons in the port, therefore impacting negatively on terminals train turnaround times. These delays lead to vessels bypassing the Port of Richards due to longer times spent on outer anchorage while the terminal is building up tonnage to meet the vessels capacity.

Secondly, customers also resort to Back of Port sidings to compensate prolonged wagon dwelling times in the Port resulting from several delays in offloading, with de-tarping as one of the key enablers. This increase in the Back of Port shunting trucks calling into the Port results in unnecessary congestion and impacts negatively on the Terminals efficiencies.

The successful execution of this operation is critical to maintaining the supply chain and ensuring that the magnetite reaches its destination in a timely and efficient manner.

The purpose of this scope of work is to acquire a service provider to provide general workers for a de-tarping contract for a period of fourteen (14) days at Transnet Port Terminal Richards Bay. The contract will assist the business:

- To efficiently offload magnetite from incoming trains.
- Maintain a daily throughput of at least 5 trains.

4 General Contract Activities

4.1 Detarping of Rail Wagons.

- 4.1.1 Service providers shall be required to detach the wagons on the designated areas namely:
- All Tippler Staging Lines.
 - 7 Series (as and when required for Rock Phosphate).
 - 6 Series (as and when required for RBM Sulphate).
- 4.1.2 Stockpile Management: - Cleaning of magnetite staging lines, routes and stockpiles
- 4.1.3 Bidders must note that the above requirement is indicative and may change at any point of intent, therefore, resources may be allocated on areas where there is a need.
- 4.1.4 Health and Safety is a critical elementary factor required on a mandatory bases when detarping of wagons as they may be injuries resulting from failure to observe safe working protocols.
- 4.1.5 Service providers ensure that their employees do not work on moving rails wagons.
- 4.1.6 Service provider to ensure that their employees do not cross in between rail wagons but use designated walkways.
- 4.1.7 Service must always inspect and regulate how employees work under these risky areas to avoid escalation of hazards which may lead to severe injuries and or fatality.
- 4.1.8 Service provider reports all unsafe working conditions immediately to the Transnet representative responsible for the shift they are working on.
- 4.1.9 The service provider reports all incidents, near-misses and injuries immediately to Transnet.
- 4.1.10 Safety precautions of working on the railway lines must be taken very seriously.

- 6.1.3 At times a service provider may be required to adjust detarping team numbers based on demand and level of criticality. With this requirement, service providers should be able to respond positively with agility at a time of intent.
