3 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

Transnet has implemented a new electronic tender submission system, the e-Tender Submission Portal, in line with the overall Transnet digitalization strategy where suppliers can view advertised tenders, register their information, log their intent to respond to bids and upload their bid proposals/responses on to the system.

4 RFP INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Please sign documents [sign, stamp and date the bottom of each page] before uploading them on the system. The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the respondent to do so.
- 4.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 5] must be returned with proposals.
- 4.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 4.4 Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to clause 15 [Alterations made by the Respondent to Bid Prices] of the General Bid Conditions, paragraph 12 below (Legal Review) and Section 6 of the RFP, alterations, additions, or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

5 JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If at the time of the bid submission such a JV or consortium agreement has not been concluded, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note that for the purpose of Evaluation, a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card (a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate) as per the B-BBEE Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 preference point scoring.

6 COMMUNICATION

- 6.1 For specific queries relating to this RFP, an RFP Clarification Request Form should be submitted onto the system and to [Ruth Springbok] before 16:00 pm on 21 April 2023, substantially in the form set out in Section 8 hereto. In the interest of fairness and transparency, Transnet's response to such a query will be published on the e-tender portal and Transnet website.

- 6.3 Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 6.4 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 6.5 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- 6.6 Transnet will publish the outcome of this RFP in the National Treasury e-tender portal and Transnet website with 10 days after the award has been finalised. Respondents are required to check the National

Treasury e-tender Portal and Transnet website for the results of the tender process. All unsuccessful bidders have a right to request Transnet to furnish individual reasons for their bid not being successful. This requested must be directed to the contact person stated in the SBD 1 form

7 CONFIDENTIALITY

All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information related to this RFP or the subsequent contract, written approval must be obtained from Transnet.

8 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the **Service provider**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

9 EMPLOYMENT EQUITY ACT

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

10 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 10.1 modify the RFP's Goods/Services and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- 10.2 reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- 10.3 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 10.4 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 10.5 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 10.6 cancel the bid process;
- 10.7 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;
- 10.8 request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;
- 10.9 not accept any changes or purported changes by the Respondent to the bid rates after the closing date and/or after the award of the business, unless the contract specifically provided for it;
- 10.10 to cancel the contract and/request that National Treasury place the Respondent on its Database of Restricted Suppliers for a period not exceeding 10 years, on the basis that a contract was awarded on the strength of incorrect information furnished by the Respondent or on any other basis recognised in law;
- 10.11 to award the business to the next ranked bidder, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Goods at the quoted price, should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the

contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. Under such circumstances, the validity of the bids of the next ranked bidder(s) will be deemed to remain valid, irrespective of whether the outcome of the tender has been published the outcome of the bid process on the National Treasury etender Portal and Transnet website. Bidders may therefore be requested to advise whether they would still be prepared to provide the required Goods at their quoted price.

Note that Transnet will not reimburse any Respondent for any preparatory costs or other work performed in connection with its Proposal, whether or not the Respondent is awarded a contract.

11 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business. A material deviation from the Standard terms or conditions could result in disqualification.

12 SECURITY CLEARANCE

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the Goods/Services and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of **CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET**. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

13 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Respondents must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

14 TAX COMPLIANCE

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Respondents/ individuals who wish to submit bids.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

SECTION 3: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) has an infrastructure that is open-ended. The infrastructure comprises of perway, overhead and ground cable, signalling equipment, electrical substations, and relay rooms, etc.

Infrastructure to be protected covers thousands of kilometres of the rail reserve, countrywide. The Security and Forensics department has a hybrid of in-house and contracted security personnel, to provide security of the infrastructure. Security incidents such as cable theft, vandalism of business-critical infrastructure, etc. have a negative impact on the goals of business, to move planned tonnages.

A security response requires intelligence-based operations, to combat these crimes, which include the scrap metal dealers that export stolen infrastructure which results in escalated theft and vandalism of business-critical infrastructure of TFR. Many of the incidents experienced are syndicate related, ranging from copper theft syndicates, Goods-in-Transit syndicates, and other syndicates in the scrap metal industry.

The socio-economic conditions in the country, i.e., high levels of unemployment, poverty, etc. inevitably and by default, make open ended infrastructure a target of theft.

2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Whereas Transnet is seeking a partner(s) to provide solutions for identification and investigation of organised groupings involved in ferrous & non-ferrous metals theft for security services at Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) on a national level for a period three years (36 months), it also seeks to improve its current processes for providing these Services to its end user community throughout its locations.

The selected Service provider(s) must share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met by meeting contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Service provider(s) will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partnership will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service and profitability.

Specifically, Transnet seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- **2.1** Transnet must receive reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Service provider's economies of scale and streamlined service processes.
- **2.2** Transnet must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both Transnet and the chosen Service provider(s).
- **2.3** Transnet must receive proactive improvements from the Service provider with respect to the provision of Services and related processes.
- **2.4** Transnet's overall competitive advantage must be strengthened by the chosen Service provider's leadingedge technology and service delivery systems.
- **2.5** Transnet end users must be able to rely on the chosen Service provider's personnel for service enquiries, recommendations, and substitutions.
- **2.6** Transnet must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Services, including managed service processes on a Group basis.

3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Technical Specification Service Description

For reasons stated, TFR needs specialised security information gathering services in the form of:

- Information gathering and profiling of criminal syndicates (members) and scrap metal dealers colluding with such crime syndicates;
- Effective operations with reaction/task teams aimed at arresting and building case dockets to assist
 with successfully prosecuting criminals involved in the theft of TFR assets.
- These investigations will not be limited and can be extended to other fields of investigations as the need arises, but all investigations demand specialised knowledge, professional and personal skills.
- These investigations will not be limited and can be extended to the yards, terminals, and other
 operational areas within TFR as the need arises.
- It is a requirement that the bidder should have at least ten years' provable experience in the
 information gathering, investigation, and operations field, dealing with business-critical
 infrastructure (Perway, overhead and ground cable, signalling equipment, electrical substations,
 and relay rooms, etc) with a particular emphasis in Ferrous & NonFerrous Metals theft.
- The bidder should have in its employment or venture a legal team either being an admitted attorney or advocate.
- The legal team should possess training and experience in all facets of criminal law with business-critical infrastructure (Perway, overhead and ground cable, signalling equipment, electrical substations, and relay rooms, etc) and with a particular emphasis in Ferrous & Non-Ferrous Metals theft; and the working and application of prevention of Organised Crime and the Criminals matters Amendment Act. The legal team must be able to initiate court proceedings, both Civil and Criminal and be able to assist in the recovery of proceeds from the crime through the Asset Forfeiture Unit.
- The bidder to showcase a minimum of five (05) criminal (high profile) court matters where success
 was attained.
- The bidder must provide proof that the bidding company has the necessary the tools of trade (4 X 4 Vehicles, night site equipment, bi-noculars, bullet proofs, firearms, thermal imaging technology, helicopter / light aircraft/Unmanned Aerial Vehicles with the required thermal imaging systems for detailed images, alarm systems, CCTV technology) which will be required for execution of the task.
- The services that TFR requires is to ensure there is a reduction in theft in the short term (12 months) nationally.

3.2 Compliance

All information gathered, identification and investigation of organised groupings involved in Ferrous & Non-Ferrous Metals theft on behalf of TFR will be done in accordance with:

- The South Africa (SA) Constitution
- The SA Bill of Rights
- Criminal Procedure Act, 51 of 1977, as amended
- Interception of Communications and Provision of Communication related Information Act, 70 of 2002.
- Protection of Personal Information Act No 4 of 2013.

3.3 Management System Requirements

Conduct risk assessments as required. Provide comprehensive cost effective and innovative risk management service for specified areas when required. Compile technical and operational assessments of current security systems and make suggestions to improve on current systems or standards.

Have an existing electronic database insofar as it relates to:

- Criminal Incidents
- Suspects
- Syndicates
- Asset Recovery
- Arrests
- Convictions
- The bidder will supply a dual server that can be housed in a safe location decided by TFR so that
 the data link from the bidder's electronic database to TFR can be accessed without delays to
 retrieve data pertaining to TFR. Access levels to the electronic database will be decided and
 managed by the TFR GM: Security and Forensics.
- The bidder is to furnish TFR with electronic backups of all data gathered monthly in the form of a flash or hard disk drive.
- Conduct situation analysis focused on but not limited to the scrap metal market in the Republic of South Africa and neighbouring countries and advise management on pro-active measures.
- Conduct profiling on the results of the situation analysis and provide criminal trend analysis.
- Investigate criminal activities committed by but not limited to, metal merchants, smelters, exporters and/or metallurgical laboratories relating but not limited to the trading, transporting or handling of TFR's stolen conductor/cable and any TFR goods stolen in transit.
- Investigate criminal activities committed by individuals or syndicates responsible for amongst others the theft of conductor cables on TFR network, perway infrastructure and theft of rolling stock components.
- Compile focused project and operational plans to address illegal or suspected illegal trading in TFR's stolen assets (e.g., conductor cables, perway infrastructure and goods stolen in transit).
- Identify hotspots and execute effects-based operations in collaboration with law enforcement agencies.
- Establish mobile investigation teams to investigate syndicate activities in hotspots with the aim of apprehending these, and to effectively manage criminal cases for successful prosecution.

3.4 Pro-Active Objectives

- Evaluate those preventive measures currently being implemented and/or established both internally
 and externally to address illegal trading in stolen conductor cable, perway infrastructure or goods
 stolen in transit emanating from previous investigation experience.
- Based on the results of the evaluation that would determine whether additional and/or refined
 preventative measures may need to be considered to reduce the number of individuals or
 syndicates targeting TFR assets.
- Ensure that adequate investigations resources are maintained in accordance with TFR's requirements.
- Interaction and coordination with South African Law Enforcement Agencies and/or Authorities.
- Interaction and coordination with accredited Private Security Industry role-players.
- Keeping TFR abreast of developments within the trade of copper-based metals locally and internationally.

3.5 Proactive functions

Amongst other functions listed, services provided by the appointed bidder must include:

- profiling of criminal syndicates;
- the monitoring and gathering information of the activities of identified criminal syndicates;
- initiate effects-based operations to apprehend criminal syndicate members after sufficient evidence is gathered to ensure successful prosecution and conviction.
- to monitor the syndicate members after their bail release.
- to support the criminal justice system during the prosecution process, and act as custodian in criminal cases of interest to TFR and be able to provide sound advice National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) and South African Police Service (SAPS) concerning best cause of action in the matters.



 - (e) recommend that the bidder or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted by the National Treasury from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the audi alteram partem (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
 - (f) forward the matter for criminal prosecution.
