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

The South African Port System





TNPA Core Functions

Landlord

Promote the use, improvement and development of ports, and control land use within the ports, having the power to lease port land under conditions it determines

Master planner

Plan, improve, develop and maintain port infrastructure

Regulator and Controller

Make and apply rules to control navigation within port limits and approaches, ensure protection of the environment and ensure safety and security within port limits

Controller of ports services & facilities

Ensure that port services and facilities are provided, and may enter into agreements or licence other parties to provide these

Marketer & administrator

Ensure that adequate, affordable, equitable and efficient port services and facilities are provided for port users

Change agent

Ensure non-discriminatory, fair, transparent access to port services and facilities; advancement of previously disadvantaged people; promotion of representivity and participation in terminal operations; enhanced transparency in port management

Coordinator with other state agencies

Advise on all matters relating to the port sector, and liaise with all stakeholders

Port of Richards Bay Master Plan



The proposed Container Handling Facility is aligned to the Port of Richards Bay Master Plan as per initiative 8 which also proposes the construction of Berth 605 for the handling of containers which will be TNPA's responsibility to develop as indicated in initiative 10 below:



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

Discussion



- □ The Port of Richards Bay currently handles containers at the 600-series (MPT Handling Facility) which consists of Berths 606, 607 & 608. The current Multi-Purpose Terminal (MPT) has a capacity of 50 000 TEUs;
- □ TNPA estimates that the proposed Container Handling Facility will grow to an estimated capacity of 200,000 TEUs;
- The proposed Container Handling Facility in the Port Richards Bay is well suited to serve the Northern part of KwaZulu-Natal province due to the proximity as compared to Durban Port. This will not only reduce the logistics cost but also the transportation time; and
- It is the Bidder's responsibility to conduct market analysis when responding to this RFP and build a solid business case which reflects container volumes that warrants the Bidders development of a Container Handling Facility in the Port of Richards Bay.

The Salient Features of RFP



- □ It is a greenfield site with a total footprint of approximately 675 000 m² (square meters). However, the RFP states that the bidder must indicate the proposed footprint required for developing a Container Handling Facility in line with their business case;
- □ The RFP indicates that a bidder's concept design must incorporate the use of Berth 606 only and subsequent use of Berth 605 once developed; and
- The RFP's Qualification & Evaluation criteria has been developed to be robust enough to attract a bidder that has some experience while also allowing opportunity for emerging players within the Container handling operations to participate as follows:
 - \rightarrow A bidder with 2 5 years' experience in Container handling operations;
 - > A bidder that has achieved average throughput volumes between 10 000 20 000 TEUs over the past 2 years;
 - > A bidder with EBITDA of between R1 million to R2 million; and
 - > A bidder that can demonstrate ability in raising capital for projects of this nature.

PART II - QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

- Qualification Criteria 1 : Administrative
 Responsiveness
- Timely Submission of Bid Response
- Bid Response Duly Signed on all relevant documents
- Submission of all Essential Returnable including the following:
 - a valid and certified copy of a B-BBEE certificate or a joint affidavit for the Consortium that is not older than 12 (twelve) months and which is issued by a SANAS certified agency, or a valid affidavit (in the case of a Qualifying Small Enterprise or Exempt Micro Enterprise) confirming that the Bidder has at least a B-BBEE certificate:
 - a valid proof of tax compliance through registration as a taxpayer; and
 - a Business Case (as outlined in Annex CC).
- Qualification Criteria 2: Substantive Responsiveness (Mandatory Returnable)
- Concession Fee Offer



Bidders who comply with all the requirements of Administrative and Substantive Responsiveness will be eligible for evaluation under Part III Evaluation Criteria

PART III - EVALUATION CRITERIA STAGE 1 FUNCTIONALITY

- Previous Exp. & Track Record (40)
- SHE & Risk (10)
- Financial Capacity (50)
- Business Case (100) comprising of:
 - Market Analysis (20)
 - Financial Management Plan (20)
 - Operating Model (20)
 - Project Schedule (10)
 - Concept Design (10)
 - Funding Model (20)

TOTAL POINTS = 200



Minimum Score of 140 points (70%) of the Total 200 Points required to be eligible for evaluation under Stage 2 of this Evaluation Criteria. A Bidder who does not meet the minimum 140 points (70%), will not receive any further consideration.

PART III-EVALUATION CRITERIA – STAGE 2 PRICE & PREFERENCE

Price:

Concession Fee Offer (90)

Points Scored = Points out of 100 x

Preference:

90% = 90 points

B-BBEE Scorecard (10)

Points Scored = Points out of 100 x 10% = 10 points

On completion of the evaluation under Stage 2, Bidders will be ranked and be eligible for appointment as the Preferred Bidder provided, there is no objective Criteria which justifies the appointment of another Bidder other than the Highest Ranked Bidder

PART IV - DUE DILIGENCE

Detailed Due diligence will be conducted on all bidders who meet the requirements of Part III stage 1 & 2





If no Criteria under Due Diligence/Probity Check which justifies the appointment of another Bidder other than the Highest Ranked Bidders, the Bidder who scores the highest points will be appointed as the Preferred Bidder and the Bidder with the Second Highest will be appointed the Reserve Bidder.
