4. RECORD OF DISCUSSION:

This is a compulsory tender briefing meeting; the meeting is being recorded for minute purposes.

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5. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION:

The bid submission process through the newly implemented electronic tender submission system was explained to the tenderers. The following was highlighted:

The bid submission process was detailed to the tenderers as per page 2 of Part 1 of the RFP document.

Bidders were informed to take note of the further upload of RFP Part 2 and 3 that is updated.

6. TECHNICAL SCOPE

PM gave a background on Transnet Pipelines business, Executive Summary of the project, current status, a high-level objective and few other deliverables.

6.1. Scope Background

The appointment of a Fire & Rescue Standby Services at Transnet Pipelines (TPL) facilities and the pipeline network situated in Gauteng, Mpumalanga, Free State, KwaZulu Natal, and North-West provinces, as and when required for three years.

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Transnet Pipelines (TPL), a division of Transnet SOC Ltd, provides strategic pipeline infrastructure for the petroleum and gas industries of South Africa. Established in 1965, TPL owns, maintains, and operates a network of 3 114 km of high-pressure petroleum and gas pipelines. The pipeline transverses five different provinces (Kwa-Zulu Natal, Gauteng, Northwest, Free States and Mpumalanga) ensuring security of supply of petroleum products into the inland market, as per Figure 1 below.

6.2. Study Objective

The objective of employing Fire & Rescue Standby Services is to enhance safety and fire prevention across TPL. It is therefore crucial that TPL has a contract in place with sufficient funds to ensure that all high-risk activities with the potential of fire are managed properly and that all fire incidents that may occur are dealt with immediately. The objectives of this contract are to reduce impacts on the public, and the environment, and reduce business interruptions.

Works To Be Undertaken

- The appointed service provider's employees must attend TPL induction every 12 months.
- 2. The appointed service provider is required to sign task-specific risk assessment and work permit before the commencement of any work on site.
- 3. Attendance registers for all personnel doing standby for each shift/ day must be signed daily by the TPL representative at the end of each shift.
- 4. Successful bidder shall be required to have adequate resources to accommodate day and night shifts in line with Labour Relations Act, 66 of 1995 requirements. Personnel must only work a maximum of 12-hour shifts. Arrangements for relief must be made for all work exceeding 12 hours.

6.3. Scope of Service

7. TENDER EVALUATIONS

The tender evaluation procedure and steps were discussed and explained to the tenderers as follow (these are also clearly stated in the tender document):

8.1 <u>Technical Pre-qualification Criteria</u>

- 1. Fire Officers: Minimum of 3 Officers
 - Fire Fighter 1 and 2 (Qualification issued by SAESI)
 - Hazmat Awareness and Operations (Qualification issued by SAESI)
 - Hazard Identification/Risk assessment Qualification, from any accredited institution by SAQA- South African Qualification Authority.
 - Rope rescue (High angle or confined space rescue from accredited SAQA institution.)
 - Valid First Aid level 3, issued by SAQA accredited institution.
- 2. Fire Fighters, Minimum of 6 fire fighters
 - Fire Fighter 1(Qualification issued by SAESI)
 - Hazmat Awareness (Qualification issued by SAESI)
 - Rope rescue (High angle or confined space rescue) Accredited by SAQA

First Aid level 3, issued by SAQA accredited institution

7.1. Functionality Criteria

The functionality criteria and maximum score in respect of each of the criteria are as follows:

Minimum qualifying score required:	70	

The minimum overall qualifying for score for functionality shall be 70 points out of 100. Any tenderer that fails to obtain the minimum qualifying score for functionality will be regarded as an unacceptable tender. Only those tenderers who obtain the minimum qualifying score for functionality will be evaluated further in terms of price and the applicable preference point system.

Tenderers are to ensure all returnable documents are signed and returned with their tender and that all required information requested in the returnable is submitted.

All returnables are to be valid at the time of the tender closing.

7.2. Price and Specific Goals

Price and preference evaluation is in accordance with the 80/20 preference points systems as described in Preferential Procurement Regulations 6 and 7. Whereby 80 points is awarded where the financial value is estimated to not exceed R50 million, inclusive of all applicable taxes. Should the BBBEE rating not be provided, tenderers with no verification will score zero points for preference.

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Preference points for this bid shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price;
- (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution; and
- (c) Any other specific goal determined in Transnet preferential procurement policy.

The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

8. PRICING SCHEDULE
