- 4.1. Award the business to the highest scoring Tenderer/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another tenderer.
- 4.2. Not necessarily accept the lowest priced tender or an alternative Tender;
- 4.3. Go to the open market if the quoted rates (for award of work) are deemed unreasonable;

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- 4.4. Should the Tenderers be awarded business on strength of information furnished by the Tenderer, which after conclusion of the contract is proved to have been incorrect, Transnet reserves the right to terminate the contract;
- 4.5. Request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;

1. Stage One - Eligibility in terms of the Construction Industry Development Board:

Only those tenderers who are registered with the CIDB, or are capable of being so prior to the evaluation of submissions, in a contractor grading designation equal to or higher than a contractor grading designation determined in accordance with the sum tendered or a value determined in accordance with Regulation 25 (1B) or 25(7A) of the Construction Industry Development Regulations, designation of **3ME** or higher class of construction work, are eligible to have their tenders evaluated.

Any tenderer that fails to meet the stipulated eligibility criteria will be regarded as an unacceptable tender.

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2. Stage Two - Functionality:

Only those tenderers who obtain the minimum qualifying score for functionality will be evaluated further in terms of price and the applicable preference point system. The minimum qualifying for score for functionality is **70 points**.

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PREAMBLE.

Transnet values full compliance with all relevant laws and regulations, ethical standards and the principles of economical use of resources, fairness and transparency in its relations with its Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors.

In order to achieve these goals, Transnet and the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor hereby enter into this agreement hereinafter referred to as the "Integrity Pact" which will form part of the Tenderer's/Service Provider's/Contractor's application for registration with Transnet as a vendor.

The general purpose of this Integrity Pact is to agree on avoiding all forms of dishonesty, fraud and corruption by following a system that is fair, transparent and free from any undue influence prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of any procurement and/or reverse logistics event and any further contract to be entered into between the Parties, relating to such event.

All Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractor's will be required to sign and comply with undertakings contained in this Integrity Pact, should they want to be registered as a Transnet vendor.

1 **OBJECTIVES**

- Transnet and the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor agree to enter into this Integrity Pact, to avoid all forms of dishonesty, fraud and corruption including practices that are anti-competitive in nature, negotiations made in bad faith and under-pricing by following a system that is fair, transparent and free from any influence/unprejudiced dealings prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of the contract to be entered into with a view to:
 - a) Enable Transnet to obtain the desired contract at a reasonable and competitive price in conformity to the defined specifications of the works, goods and services; and
 - Enable Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors to abstain from bribing or b) participating in any corrupt practice in order to secure the contract.

2 **COMMITMENTS OF TRANSNET**

Transnet commits to take all measures necessary to prevent dishonesty, fraud and corruption and to observe the following principles:

- Transnet hereby undertakes that no employee of Transnet connected directly or 2.1 indirectly with the sourcing event and ensuing contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept directly or through intermediaries any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the Tenderer, either for themselves or for any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the tendering process, Tender evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to any contract.
- 2.2 Transnet will, during the registration and tendering process treat all Tenderers/ Service Providers/Contractor with equity, transparency and fairness. Transnet will in particular, before and during the registration process, provide to all Tenderers/ Service Providers/Contractors the same information and will not provide to any Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors confidential/additional information through

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


which the Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors could obtain an advantage in relation to any tendering process.

- 2.3 Transnet further confirms that its employees will not favour any prospective Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors in any form that could afford an undue advantage to a particular Tenderer during the tendering stage and will further treat all Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors participating in the tendering process in a fair manner.
- 2.4 Transnet will exclude from the tender process such employees who have any personal interest in the Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors participating in the tendering process.

3 OBLIGATIONS OF THE TENDERER / SERVICE PROVIDER

- 3.1 Transnet has a **'Zero Gifts'** Policy. No employee is allowed to accept gifts, favours or benefits.
 - a) Transnet officials and employees **shall not** solicit, give or accept, or from agreeing to solicit, give, accept or receive directly or indirectly, any gift, gratuity, favour, entertainment, loan, or anything of monetary value, from any person or juridical entities in the course of official duties or in connection with any operation being managed by, or any transaction which may be affected by the functions of their office.
 - b) Transnet officials and employees **shall not** solicit or accept gifts of any kind, from vendors, suppliers, customers, potential employees, potential vendors, and suppliers, or any other individual or organisation irrespective of the value.
 - c) Under **no circumstances** should gifts, business courtesies or hospitality packages be accepted from or given to prospective suppliers participating in a tender process at the respective employee's Operating Division, regardless of retail value.
 - d) Gratuities, bribes or kickbacks of any kind must never be solicited, accepted or offered, either directly or indirectly. This includes money, loans, equity, special privileges, personal favours, benefit or services. Such favours will be considered to constitute corruption.
- 3.2 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its Tender or during any ensuing contract stage in order to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and in particular the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor commits to the following:
 - a) The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to Transnet or to any of Transnet's employees involved in the tendering process or to any third person any material or other benefit or payment, in order to obtain in exchange an advantage during the tendering process; and

immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any employee of Transnet, connected directly or indirectly with the tendering process, or to any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the tendering, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.

- The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not collude with other parties interested 3.3 in the contract to preclude a competitive Tender price, impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the tendering process, Tender evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract. The Tenderer / Service Provider further commits itself to delivering against all agreed upon conditions as stipulated within the contract.
- 3.4 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not enter into any illegal or dishonest agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal with other Tenderers/Service Providers/Contractors. This applies in particular to certifications, submissions or nonsubmission of documents or actions that are restrictive or to introduce cartels into the tendering process.
- 3.5 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not commit any criminal offence under the relevant anti-corruption laws of South Africa or any other country. Furthermore, the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not use for illegitimate purposes or for restrictive purposes or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information provided by Transnet as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- 3.6 A Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor of foreign origin shall disclose the name and address of its agents or representatives in South Africa, if any, involved directly or indirectly in the registration or tendering process. Similarly, the Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor of South African nationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any, involved directly or indirectly in the registration or tendering process.
- 3.7 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not misrepresent facts or furnish false or forged documents or information in order to influence the tendering process to the advantage of the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor or detriment of Transnet or other competitors.
- Transnet may require the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor to furnish Transnet with 3.8 a copy of its code of conduct. Such code of conduct must address the compliance programme for the implementation of the code of conduct and reject the use of bribes and other dishonest and unethical conduct.
- 3.9 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.
- 3.10 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor confirms that they will uphold the ten principles of the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC) in the fields of Human Rights,





Labour, Anti-Corruption and the Environment when undertaking business with Transnet as follows:

- a) Human Rights
- Principle 1: Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights; and
- Principle 2: make sure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.
- b) Labour

- Principle 5: the effective abolition of child labour; and
- Principle 6: the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation.
- c) Environment
- · Principle 7: Businesses should support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges;
- Principle 8: undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility; and
- Principle 9: encourage the development and diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies.
- d) Anti-Corruption
- · Principle 10: Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery.

INDEPENDENT TENDERING

- 4.2 The Tenderer has arrived at his submitted Tender independently from, and without consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor. However

- 4.3 In particular, without limiting the generality of paragraph 5 above, there has been no consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor regarding:
 - a) prices;
 - b) geographical area where Goods or Services will be rendered [market allocation];
 - c) methods, factors or formulas used to calculate prices;
 - d) the intention or decision to submit or not to submit, a Tender;
 - e) the submission of a Tender which does not meet the specifications and conditions of the RFP; or
 - f) tendering with the intention of not winning the Tender.
- 4.4 In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the Goods or Services to which his/her tender relates.
- 4.5 The terms of the Tender as submitted have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the Tenderer, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official Tender opening or of the awarding of the contract.
- 4.6 Tenderers are aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to Tenders and contracts, Tenders that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and/or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority [NPA] for criminal investigation and/or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 [ten] years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
- 4.7 Should the Tenderer find any terms or conditions stipulated in any of the relevant documents quoted in the Tender unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead, attached to its submitted Tender. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

5 DISQUALIFICATION FROM TENDERING PROCESS

5.1 If the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor has committed a transgression through a violation of section 3 of this Integrity Pact or in any other form such as to put its reliability or credibility as a Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor into question, Transnet may reject the Tenderer's / Service Provider's / Contractor's application from the registration or tendering process and remove the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor from its database, if already registered.

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- 5.2 If the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor has committed a transgression through a violation of section 3, or any material violation, such as to put its reliability or credibility into question. Transnet may after following due procedures and at its own discretion also exclude the Tenderer/Service Provider /Contractor from future tendering processes. The imposition and duration of the exclusion will be determined by the severity of the transgression. The severity will be determined by the circumstances of the case, which will include amongst others the number of transgressions, the position of the transgressors within the company hierarchy of the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor and the amount of the damage. The exclusion will be imposed for up to a maximum of 10 (ten) years. However, Transnet reserves the right to impose a longer period of exclusion, depending on the gravity of the misconduct.
- 5.3 If the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor can prove that it has restored the damage caused by it and has installed a suitable corruption prevention system or taken other remedial measures as the circumstances of the case may require, Transnet may at its own discretion revoke the exclusion or suspend the imposed penalty.

6 TRANSNET'S LIST OF EXCLUDED TENDERERS (BLACKLIST)

- 6.1 The process of restriction is used to exclude a company/person from conducting future business with Transnet and other organs of state for a specified period. No Tender shall be awarded to a Tenderer whose name (or any of its members, directors, partners or trustees) appear on the Register of Tender Defaulters kept by National Treasury, or who have been placed on National Treasury's List of Restricted Suppliers. Transnet reserves the right to withdraw an award, or cancel a contract concluded with a Tenderer should it be established, at any time, that a tenderer has been restricted with National Treasury by another government institution.
- 6.2 All the stipulations on Transnet's restriction process as laid down in Transnet's Supply Chain Policy and Procurement Procedures Manual (CPM included) are included herein by way of reference. Below follows a condensed summary of this restriction procedure.
- 6.3 On completion of the restriction procedure, Transnet will submit the restricted entity's details (including the identity number of the individuals and registration number of the entity) to National Treasury for placement on National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers for the specified period of exclusion. National Treasury will make the final decision on whether to restrict an entity from doing business with any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years and place the entity concerned on the Database of Restricted Suppliers published on its official website.
- 6.4 The decision to restrict is based on one of the grounds for restriction. The standard of proof to commence the restriction process is whether a "prima facie" (i.e. on the face of it) case has been established.
- 6.5 Depending on the seriousness of the misconduct and the strategic importance of the Goods/Services, in addition to restricting a company/person from future business, Transnet may decide to terminate some or all existing contracts with the company/person as well.



- 6.6 A Service Provider or Contractor to Transnet may not subcontract any portion of the contract to a blacklisted company.
- 6.7 Grounds for blacklisting include: If any person/Enterprise which has submitted a Tender, concluded a contract, or, in the capacity of agent or subcontractor, has been associated with such Tender or contract:
 - a) Has, in bad faith, withdrawn such Tender after the advertised closing date and time for the receipt of Tenders.
 - b) has, after being notified of the acceptance of his Tender, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Tender documents.
 - c) has carried out any contract resulting from such Tender in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of the contract.
 - d) has offered, promised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract.
 - e) has acted in a fraudulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any Government Department or towards any public body, Enterprise or person.
 - f) has made any incorrect statement in a certificate or other communication with regard to the Local Content of his Goods or his B-BBEE status and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that:
 - (i) he made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and
 - (ii) before making such statement, he took all reasonable steps to satisfy himself of its correctness.
 - g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the contractor's requirements and which could not be recovered from the contractor.
 - h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith.
- 6.8 Grounds for blacklisting include a company/person recorded as being a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Service Providers or Register of Tender Defaulters.
- 6.9 Companies associated with the person/s guilty of misconduct (i.e. entities owned, controlled or managed by such persons), any companies subsequently formed by the person(s) guilty of the misconduct and/or an existing company where such person(s) acquires a controlling stake may be considered for blacklisting. The decision to extend the blacklist to associated companies will be at the sole discretion of Transnet.

7 PREVIOUS TRANSGRESSIONS

7.1 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor hereby declares that no previous transgressions resulting in a serious breach of any law, including but not limited to, corruption, fraud, theft, extortion and contraventions of the Competition Act 89 of 1998, which occurred in the last 5 (five) years with any other public sector undertaking, government department or private sector company that could justify its exclusion from

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its registration on the Tenderer's/Service Provider's/Contractor's database or any tendering process.

7.2 If it is found to be that the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor made an incorrect statement on this subject, the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor can be rejected from the registration process or removed from the Tenderer/ Service Provider/Contractor database, if already registered, for such reason (refer to the Breach of Law Returnable Form contained in the document.)

8 SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS

- 8.1 Transnet shall also take all or any one of the following actions, wherever required to:
- a) Immediately exclude the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor from the tendering process or call off the pre-contract negotiations without giving any compensation the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor. However, the proceedings with the other Tenderer/ Service Provider/Contractor may continue.
- b) Immediately cancel the contract, if already awarded or signed, without giving any compensation to the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor.
- c) Recover all sums already paid by Transnet.
- d) Encash the advance bank guarantee and performance bond or warranty bond, if furnished by the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor, in order to recover the payments, already made by Transnet, along with interest.
- e) Cancel all or any other contracts with the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor; and
- f) Exclude the Tenderer/ Service Provider/Contractor from entering into any Tender with Transnet in future.

9 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- 9.1 A conflict of interest includes, inter alia, a situation in which:
- a) A Transnet employee has a personal financial interest in a tendering / supplying entity;
 and
- b) A Transnet employee has private interests or personal considerations or has an affiliation or a relationship which affects, or may affect, or may be perceived to affect his / her judgment in action in the best interest of Transnet or could affect the employee's motivations for acting in a particular manner, or which could result in, or be perceived as favouritism or nepotism.
- 9.2 A Transnet employee uses his / her position, or privileges or information obtained while acting in the capacity as an employee for:
- a) Private gain or advancement; or
- b) The expectation of private gain, or advancement, or any other advantage accruing to the employee must be declared in a prescribed form.

Thus, conflicts of interest of any Tender committee member or any person involved in the sourcing process must be declared in a prescribed form.

9.3 If a Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor has or becomes aware of a conflict of interest i.e., a family, business and / or social relationship between its owner(s)/



- member(s)/director(s)/partner(s)/shareholder(s) and a Transnet employee/ member of Transnet's Board of Directors in respect of a Tender which will be considered for the Tender process, the Tenderer/Service Provider/ Contractor:
- a) must disclose the interest and its general nature, in the Request for Proposal ("RFX") declaration form; or
- b) must notify Transnet immediately in writing once the circumstances have arisen.
- 9.4 The Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any committee member or any person involved in the sourcing process, where this is done, Transnet shall be entitled forthwith to rescind the contract and all other contracts with the Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor.

10 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 10.1 Transnet recognises that trust and good faith are pivotal to its relationship with its Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor. When a dispute arises between Transnet and its Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor, the parties should use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner, whenever possible. Litigation in bad faith negates the principles of trust and good faith on which commercial relationships are based. Accordingly, following a blacklisting process as mentioned in paragraph 6 above, Transnet will not do business with a company that litigates against it in bad faith or is involved in any action that reflects bad faith on its part. Litigation in bad faith includes, but is not limited to the following instances:
- a) Vexatious proceedings: these are frivolous proceedings which have been instituted without proper grounds;
- b) **Perjury:** where a Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor make a false statement either in giving evidence or on an affidavit;
- Scurrilous allegations: where a Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor makes allegations regarding a senior Transnet employee which are without proper foundation, scandalous, abusive or defamatory; and
- d) **Abuse of court process:** when a Tenderer / Service Provider / Contractor abuses the court process in order to gain a competitive advantage during a Tender process.

11 GENERAL

- 11.1 This Integrity Pact is governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa.
- 11.2 The actions stipulated in this Integrity Pact are without prejudice to any other legal action that may follow in accordance with the provisions of the law relating to any civil or criminal proceedings.
- 11.3 The validity of this Integrity Pact shall cover all the tendering processes and will be valid for an indefinite period unless cancelled by either Party.
- 11.4 Should one or several provisions of this Integrity Pact turn out to be invalid the remainder of this Integrity Pact remains valid.

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11.5 Should a Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor be confronted with dishonest, fraudulent or corruptive behaviour of one or more Transnet employees, Transnet expects its Tenderer/Service Provider/Contractor to report this behaviour directly to a senior Transnet official/employee or alternatively by using Transnet's "Tip-Off Anonymous" hotline number 0800 003 056, whereby your confidentiality is guaranteed.

The Parties hereby declare that each of them has read and understood the clauses of this Integrity Pact and shall abide by it. To the best of the Parties' knowledge and belief, the information provided in this Integrity Pact is true and correct.







1. The conditions of contract

1.1. How the contract prices work and assesses it for progress payments

Clause 11 in NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract, June 2005 and 2013 (ECC) Option B states:

- (21) The Bill of Quantities is the bill of quantities as changed in accordance with this contract to accommodate implemented compensation events and for accepted quotations for acceleration.
- (22) Defined Cost is the cost of the components in the Shorter Schedule of Cost Components whether work is subcontracted or not excluding the cost of preparing quotations for compensation events.
- (28) The Price for Work Done to Date is the total of
- the quantity of the work which the *Contractor* has completed for each item in the Bill of Quantities multiplied by the rate and
- a proportion of each lump sum which is the proportion of the work covered by the item which the *Contractor* has completed.

Completed work is work without Defects which would either delay or be covered by immediately following work.

(31) The Prices are the lump sums and the amounts obtained by multiplying the rates by the quantities for the items in the Bill of Quantities.

This confirms that Option B is a re-measurement contract and the bill comprises only items measured using quantities and rates or stated as lump sums. Value related items are not used. Time related items are items measured using rates where the rate is a unit of time.

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1.2. **Function of the Bill of Quantities**

Clause 55.1 in Option B states, "Information in the Bill of Quantities is not Works Information or Site Information". This confirms that instructions to do work or how it is to be done are not included in the Bill, but in the Works Information. This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The Contractor Provides the Works in accordance with the Works Information". Hence the Contractor does **not** Provide the Works in accordance with the Bill of Quantities. The Bill of Quantities is only a pricing document.

1.3. **Guidance before pricing and measuring**

Employers preparing tenders or contract documents, and tendering contractors are advised to consult the sections dealing with the bill of quantities in the NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract (June 2005) Guidance Notes before preparing the bill of quantities or before entering rates and lump sums into the bill.

Historically bill of quantities based contracts in South Africa have been influenced by the different approaches of the civil engineering and building sectors of the industry through their respective discipline based standard forms of contract and methods of measurement. This is particularly apparent in the approach to the Preliminary and General bill. On the other hand, because ECC caters for a number of disciplines in the same contract, including electrical works, a different approach not currently found in local methods of measurement to the Preliminary & General bill items may have been used.

The NEC approach to the P & G bill assumes use will be made of method related charges for Equipment applied to Providing the Works based on durations shown in the Accepted Programme, fixed charges for the use of Equipment that is required throughout the construction phase, time related charges for people working in a supervisory capacity for the period required, and lump sum charges for other facilities or services not directly related to performing work items typically included in other parts of the bill.

2.2. **General assumptions**

- 2.2.1. Unless otherwise stated, items are measured net in accordance with the drawings, and no allowance has been made in the quantities for waste.
- 2.2.2. The Prices and rates stated for each item in the Bill of Quantities shall be treated as being fully inclusive of all work, risks, liabilities, obligations, overheads, profit and everything necessary as incurred or required by the *Contractor* in carrying out or providing that item.
- 2.2.3. Clause 63.13 in Option B provides that these rates and Prices may be used as a basis for assessment of compensation events instead of Defined Cost.
- 2.2.4. Where this contract requires detailed drawings, designs or other information to be provided, and no rates or prices are included in the bill specifically for such matters, then the Contractor is deemed to have allowed for all costs associated with such requirements within the tendered rates and Prices in the Bill of Quantities.

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¹ Provisional Sums should not be used unless absolutely unavoidable. Rather include specifications and associated bill items for the most likely scope of work, and then change later using the compensation event procedure if necessary. This is because tenderers cannot programme effectively for unknown scopes of work

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- 2.2.5. An item against which no Price is entered will be treated as covered by other Prices or rates in the bill of quantities. If a number of items are grouped together for pricing purposes, this will be treated as a single lump sum.
- 2.2.6. The quantities contained in the Bill of Quantities may not be final and do not necessarily represent the actual amount of work to be done. The quantities of work assessed and certified for payment by the Project Manager at each assessment date will be used for determining payments due and not the quantities given in the Bill of Quantities.
- 2.2.7. The short descriptions of the items of payment given in the bill of quantities are only for the purposes of identifying the items. More detail regarding the extent of the work entailed under each item is provided in the Works Information.

- 2.1.2 The *Employer* grants the *Contractor* a licence to use the copyright in design data presented to the *Contractor* for the purpose of the *works*.
- 2.2 Equipment required to be included in the works
- 2.2.1 None
- 3 Construction
- 3.1 Temporary works, Site services & construction constraints
- 3.1.1 *Employer's* Site entry and security control, permits, and Site regulations

- 3.1.2 The *Contractor* shall always ensure the safe passage of traffic to and around the working areas. No lights are to be fixed anywhere without written approval from the *Project Manager*.
- 3.1.3 Restrictions to access on Site, roads, walkways and barricades

Access permits for the contractor's staff and vehicles to be arranged with the *Project Manager* for the duration of the construction period.

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Access permits shall be made by the *Contractor* to a standard acceptable to the *Project Manager*, to be allowed for within the *Contractor's* access control provision and shall include at least the following information:

- 3.1.4 People restrictions on Site; hours of work, conduct and records:
- 3.1.4.1 The working hours shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Labour or with the agreement of the relevant trade unions. This information relating to working hours shall be supplied to the *Project Manager* prior to commencement of the proposed working hours.
- 3.1.4.2 The *Contractor* keeps daily records of his people engaged on the Site and Working Areas (including Subcontractors) with access to such daily records available for inspection by the *Project Manager* at all reasonable times.
- 3.1.5 Health and safety facilities on Site

The provision of security for the Contractor's site establishment shall be his own responsibility.

Both the "Factories, Machinery and Building work Act (Act 22 of 1941) and the "Machinery and Occupational Safety Act (Act 6 of 1983)" shall, wherever they appear in the SANS 1200 standardized specifications, be substituted by the "Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993)".

3.1.6 Cooperating with and obtaining acceptance of others

The *Contractor* shall not commit or permit any act that may interfere with the performance of the other parties operating in the area and shall carry out work in close liaison with the *Project Manager*.

- 3.1.7 Publicity and progress photographs
- 3.1.8.1 The *Contractor* shall obtain the permission and approval of the *Project Manager* before erecting any notice boards or using the details of the contract in any advertising media.

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- 3.1.8.2 The *Contractor* does not advertise the contract or the project to any third party, nor communicate directly with the media (in any jurisdiction) whatsoever without the express written notification and consent of the *Project Manager*.
- 3.1.8 *Contractor*'s Equipment
- 3.1.9.1 The *Contractor* keeps daily records of his Equipment used on Site and the Working Areas (distinguishing between owned and hired Equipment) with access to such daily records available for inspection by the *Project Manager* at all reasonable times.
- 3.1.9.2 All equipment, scaffolding, or any other equipment necessary shall be supplied by the *Contractor*

to successfully execute the *Works* safely, to completion. All tools, test equipment, i.e. wind-speed

indicators, rain meter etc. shall be supplied by the *Contractor*.

3.1.9 Equipment provided by the *Employer*

None.

- 3.1.10 Site services and facilities:
- 3.1.11.1 The *Contractor* shall make his own arrangements for the supply of services such as electricity, potable water, ablutions, fire protection, lighting and all other services required for undertaking the *works*. The *Contractor* shall provide, maintain and finally remove proper portable latrines of sufficient number at his cost. Latrines shall be properly constructed and placed in suitable positions and maintained in a clean and sanitary working condition.
- 3.1.11.2 Where any of the above services can be made available by the *Employer*, the cost of meters, connections, reticulation and all other usage costs associated with the provision of services shall be to the *Contractor's* account. The applicable tariffs will be those that the Local Authority charges Transnet and shall be obtained by the *Contractor*.
- 3.1.11 The *Employer* provides the following facilities for the *Contractor*:
- 3.1.12.1 A Suitable construction site will be made available free of charge to the *Contractor* for the duration of the contract.

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- 3.1.12.2 The site shall be clearly sign posted as being a construction site and shall be compliant with the relevant prevailing safety regulations and restrictions that might be in place until the Contractor has de-established from site and has been approved by the Project Manager or his duly appointed representative.
- 3.1.12.3 The layout of any construction site, if required, shall be submitted to the *Project Manager* for his approval before the *Contractor* starts erecting his camp
- 3.1.12.4 Wherever the *Employer* provides facilities (including, *inter alia*, temporary power, water, waste disposal, telecommunications etc) for the *Contractor's* use within the Working Areas and the *Contractor* adapts such facilities for use, then the *Contractor* makes good and provides full reinstatement to the land (including all apparatus of the *Employer* and Others in, on or under the land) and surrounding areas to its original standard upon dismantling of such facilities and hand-back to the *Employer*.
- 3.1.12 Facilities provided by the *Contractor:*
- 3.1.13.1 The *Contractor* shall make his own arrangements for the accommodation of all labour and comply with the requirements of the respective authorities.
- 3.1.13.2 No accommodation for the *Contractor's* and/or sub-contractor's employees will be available on site. No employee, with the exception of security watchmen, may, without written approval from the *Project Manager*, be accommodated on site.
- 3.1.13.3 The *Contractor* shall, at his own expense, provide for security and access to his construction sites as he may require. Control of access for construction plant onto public roads shall be in accordance with the requirements of the relevant roads authority and *Project Manager*.
- 3.1.13.4 No liability will be accepted by Transnet for the safekeeping of the *Contractor's* materials.
- 3.1.13 The Contractor provides the following facilities for the Project Manager and Supervisor.
- 3.1.14.1 The *Contractor* is to provide offices for two purposes, one for housing the engineers when they are on site, and the other to act as a boardroom to house site meetings. The boardroom shallaccommodate at least 8 persons.
- 3.1.14.2 Telephone facilities:
 - a) Telephone facilities for the use of the *Project Manager* are not required however the *Contractor* shall ensure that a communication system is available for the

transmission of information within a reasonable time. The Contractor will also be required to have a cell phone for his/her own use. The area is well covered by the cell phone network.

- b) The *Contractor* is required to have access to an internet connection for them to be able tosend out all the required documents including reports
- 3.1.14 Existing premises, inspection of adjoining properties and checking work of Others
- 3.1.15.1 The *Contractor* and the *Project Manager* will inspect the immediate surroundings and record any damage before work is started.
- 3.1.15 Underground services, other existing services, cable and pipe trenches and covers
- 3.1.16.1 The Contractor is required to liaise with the Project Manager and establish as accurately as possible, the location of the various existing services such as drains, underground and overhead telephone and electricity lines, ducts, poles, water mains, fittings, railway lines, etc. situated within the Works area and record all such information on a suitable "marked-up" drawing for reference at all times before any excavation or other work likely to affect the existing services commences. No services drawings are to be supplied.
 - NB: Use specialist equipment to detect and note existing underground services so as to prevent future damage and /or injury to persons.
- 3.1.16.2 All existing services shall at all times be protected and/or barricaded where these maybe affected by the *Works* or where these may endanger the safety of personnel.
- 3.1.16.3 Should relocation of existing services be necessary, this will either be carried out by Transnet or the *Contractor* under day works rates were instructed by the *Project Manager* in writing. Should known services be damaged by construction, the cost of repairs will be for the *Contractor's* account.
- 3.1.16.4 Where the *Contractor* damages a service due to negligence, he shall bear full cost of repairs to the service. These repairs will be carried out by the relevant authority, or at their discretion, by the *Contractor* to the satisfaction of the relevant authority.
- 3.1.16 Giving notice of work to be covered up

The *Contractor* shall give 24 hours notice to the *Project Manager* before covering any work.

3.1.18 Restoring of work site

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- 3.18.1 Progressive and systematic finishing and tidying will form an essential part of this contract. Under no circumstances shall spoil, rubble, materials, equipment, or unfinished operations be allowed to accumulate unnecessarily and in the event of this occurring the *Project Manager* shall have the right to withhold payment for as long as necessary in respect of the relevant works in the area(s) concerned.
- 3.18.2 All rubble to be dumped at an approved dumping site; and proof of dumping must be produced.

3.2 Completion, testing, commissioning and correction of Defects

3.2.1 The *work* to be done by the Completion Date

On or before the Completion Date the Contractor shall have done everything required to Provide the. The *Project Manager* cannot certify Completion until all the work has been done and is also free of Defects, which would have, in his opinion, prevented the *Employer* from using the works and others from doing their work.

3.2.2 Access Given by the *Employer* for Correction of Defects

The *Project Manager* arranges for the *Employer* to allow the *Contractor* access to and use of part of the *works* which he has taken over if they are needed for correcting a Defect. In this case the *defect correction period* begins when the necessary access and use have been provided

3.2.3 Testing of Equipment

The *Contractor* shall execute and submit to the *Project Manager* all test to prove that the equipment supplied under the Contract conforms in all respects to the *Scope of Work*. Successful execution of the following testing is required in respect of completion of the *Works*:

3.2.3.1 Factory Acceptance Testing

Any imported material and equipment need to be inspected, checked, and tested before shipment. The *Contractor* shall submit a list of all factory acceptance tests to be performed for all critical equipment supplied under the contract.

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The *Contractor* shall prior to shipment, submit to the *Project Manager* all test results on Plant and Material that are to be manufactured or shipped from foreign destination. No material shall on any account be shipped before receiving the *Project Manager* approval in writing.

3.2.3.2 Trial Operation Period

On successful completion of the commissioning stage the system will be put into service by the contractor. The contractor shall ensure that the system is put into service in compliance with the O&M Manual and the OHS Act and its Regulations.

A detailed procedure for conducting the trial period will be developed and agreed between the *Contractor* and the *Employer*.

The purpose of the trial operation is to demonstrate the reliability of the works, system integrity with regards to system losses and evaluate the training effectiveness of the training of lab operations personnel.

Once the trial period has commenced, the works will be operated successfully and continuously for a period of 1week, with interruptions only to alter plant settings, effect final settings and optimization, test auto-functionality and train the operator in the detail functioning of the plant. The *Project Manager* shall confirm in writing the date on which the trial operation period commenced.

During the 6 weeks trial operation period, the *Contractor* shall record all operational data and at its completion submit to the *Project Manager* a report confirming final settings, calibration, auto control functions, approved tests, and successful training of the operator to the satisfaction of the *Employer* before a Taking-Over.

The availability of the equipment during the trial operation period shall not be less than 98%.

All failures occurring during the trial period will be subject to a root cause analysis and repaired accordingly by the contractor. A failure investigation analysis and close-out report shall be submitted for each failure of the works and included in the section dealing with total plans and reports.

If declared unsuccessful, the Engineer may request a repeat of the Trial Operation period. Under such circumstances the *Contractor* shall repeat the Trial Operation Period and Performance Test as indicated herein within three months after the Engineer's request. The costs in performing this, or any further Performance Tests, will be for the *Contractor's* account.

3.2.3.3 Final performance Test after completion of Trial Period

Once the trial period has been completed successfully the Engineer shall set the date of the Final Performance Test.

The Performance Test Shall establish:

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- The capacity and characteristics of the Works are as specified, and that they meet the performance guarantees.
- b) The works can meet the performance guarantee for all the operating scenarios.

The equipment provided by the *Contractor* on site to test the performance of the equipment shall include all the instrumentation not included in the permanent installation, and all tools and suitable trained staff necessary.

Upon the outcome of the Performance Test, the *Contractor* shall inform Personnel provided by the *Employer* of all appropriate technical information derived from the result.

On successful completion of the performance Test a take-over report shall be drawn up by the *Contractor* and shall be signed by the *Project Manager*.

3.2.3.4 Defects Notification Period

All equipment supplied under this contract shall be tested and adjusted where necessary by the operator at the end of the set contractual Defects Notification Period, to prove that it continues to comply with the specified requirements.

All failures during the Defects Notification Period shall be investigated.

3.2.3.5 Test Plan and Reports

Test reports shall be submitted after the successful completion of each testing phase. The following documents shall be submitted in writing to the Employer:

- a) Testing plan
- b) Progressive testing reports as detailed in the testing plan
- c) Tests on completion: commissioning report
- d) Trial operation: Trial operation report and performance test report
- e) Failure investigation reports (where necessary) during defects notification period

- 4.2.1 The Contractor will be given a complete set of prints outs of the drawings upon which he shall, as the work progresses, record all amendments to and deviations from the drawings as issued to him at the start of the contract and the actual positions and levels of all services shall be recorded on these as-built drawings.
- 4.2.2 No additional payment for recording as-built data will be made, the costs related thereto shall be deemed to be included in the tendered rates for the related items.

4.3 Part A: Mechanical works

Design, supply, and install pipeline network with the following associated equipment: valves, flowmeters, refuelling hose &nozzle, and calibration points on the pipeline. Ensure that lock out procedure is implemented before performing any works. Decommissioning of existing piping and positive isolation is implemented.

Part A: Refuelling Facility

- Remove existing flowmeter on the refuelling line and install mechanical flowmeter (LC15) with digital display.
- Installation of calibration points as per the process flow diagram.
- Supply and install 3-inch ball valve.



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4.7 Information to be obtained from Site

The attendance of a site clarification meeting will be compulsory and the prospective Contractors shall visit the site of the proposed Works and acquaint themselves with the nature of the *Works*, the conditions under which the work is to be performed, the means of access, any limitations or other authorities and in general with all matters that influence or affect the contract.

Contractors shall be deemed to have allowed in their tender for any additional cost to be involved due to the foregoing, as no claims for any extras in connection with the position or nature of the work will be entertained.

4.8 Daily site Diary and inspection book

The *Contractor* shall provide an A4 size triplicate book to be used as a Daily Diary for the duration of the Contract. The *Project Manager* shall retain the original copy and the *Contractor* shall retain the first and second copy. The diary shall be completed on a daily basis.

In addition to this the *Contractor* shall provide an A4 size triplicate book to act as Site Instruction Book. The *Project Manager* shall retain the original copy and the *Contractor* shall retain the first and second copy. The diary shall be completed on a daily basis. Only the *Project Manager* or his *Supervisor* will have the authority to issue site instructions to the *Contractor*.

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SECTION 2

6 Management and start up

6.1 Management meetings

The *Contractor* shall attend management meetings at the *Project Manager's* request. The *Contractor* will also be required to attend a safety meeting. The *Contractor* will also attend a kick off meeting and a close off meeting. The *Contractor* will be required to present all relevant information including early warnings of compensation events, quality plans, schedules, (including progress) subcontractor management, and health, environmental and safety issues at such meetings.

All meetings are to be recorded using minutes or a register prepared and circulated by the person who convened the meeting. Such minutes or register are not to be used for the purpose of confirming actions or instructions under the contract as these are to be done separately by the person identified in the *conditions of contract* to carry out such actions or instructions.

6.2 Documentation Control

The *Contractor* shall submit all documentation complying with the *Employer's* standards and requirements. The *Employer* will issue all relevant documentation and drawings, including revisions, to the *Contractor*, but control, maintenance and handling of these documents will be the *Contractor's* sole responsibility and at its expense, and managed with a suitable document control system.

6.3 Safety risk management

6.3.1 General

The *Contractor's* attention is directed to the Health and Safety Specification TFR-ISM-RN-R&C-FM009, and in particular to his Health & Safety Program, which must be submitted with his tender, as well as the requirements of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) as amended and Regulations issued in terms thereof or un-repealed regulations issued in terms of the former Act no. 6 of 1983, in their entirety.

Without derogating from the Act or any un-repealed regulations issued in terms of legislation, or without purporting to limit the Contractor's responsibilities, the following are brought to the Contractor's attention:

- 6.3.1.1 For the purpose of the Act the site/s, to be demarcated as agreed to between the Contractor and the Project Manager before the works start, will be transferred to the control of the Contractor for the duration of the contract.
- 6.3.1.2 The *Contractor* shall appoint a health and safety coordinator to liaise at least fortnightly with the *Project Manager* on matters pertaining to occupational health and safety.

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- 6.3.1.3 The *Contractor* is an 'employer' in his own right as defined in Section 1 of the Act 85 of 1993 and he shall fulfil all his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act.
- 6.3.1.4 The *Contractor* shall furnish the *Project Manager* with full particulars of any Sub-Contractor which he may involve in the contract and the Sub-Contractor shall be made aware of all the clauses in this contract pertaining to health and safety.
- 6.3.1.5 The *Contractor* shall advise the *Project Manager* of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situation, which may arise from, work being performed either by the *Contractor* or Sub-Contractor.
- 6.3.1.6 A letter of good standing in terms of Section 80 (*Employer* to register with the Compensation Commissioner) of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Deceases Act 1993 (Act 130 of 1993), must also be furnished.
- 6.3.1.7 The *Contractor* shall comply with the current Transnet Specification TFR-ISM-RN-R&C-FM009,

Safety Arrangements and Procedural Compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety

Act,

Act 85 of 1993 and Regulations, and shall, before commencement with the execution of

Contract, which shall include site establishment and delivery of construction plant, equipment

or materials, submit to the *Project Manager:*

- documentary proof of his procedural compliance with the Act, and
- particulars of the Health and Safety Program to be implemented on the site in accordance with the Transnet Specification TFR-ISM-RN-R&C-FM009.
- The *Contractor's* Health and Safety Program will be subject to agreement by the *Project*

Manager, who may order supplementary and/or additional safety arrangements and/or

different safe working methods to ensure full compliance by the *Contractor* with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act.

6.3.1.8 All clauses in this contract pertaining to health and safety form an integral part of this contract

and if not complied with may be construed as breach of contract entitling the *Employer* to

appropriate remedies.

NB: The *Contractor* and his employees shall have valid safety inductions and medical certificates when accessing or working on site. Copies of which shall be submitted to the *Project Manager*. This will be at a time and location Transnet will arrange.

6.3.2 Hazard identification and risk assessment

The *Contractor's* appointed Site Representative and the *Project Manager* shall finalize a site-specific HIRA (Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment) document, on the day of site handover to the *Contractor*. This site-specific HIRA document, based on a continuous HIRA,

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must cover site-specific hazards and the safe management of these hazards. The HIRA document must be signed by the abovementioned representatives, and be accepted by the *Project Manager*, before any construction work can commence.

6.3.3 Substance abuse

The OHSA (Act 85 of 1993) clearly states in the Safety Regulations no. **2A "INTOXICATION"** An employer or user, as the case may be, shall not permit any person who appears to be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, to enter or remain at a workplace". Transnet Freight Rail RME enforces this legislation by means of its Substance Abuse Policy, and therefore reserves the right to do substance abuse testing on anyone who enters their premises.

6.3.4 Safety Meetings

The *Contractor* shall ensure that a safety representative is appointed and regular safety meetings are held. Written minutes of these safety meetings shall be forwarded to the *Project Manager*. All costs related to the safety aspects required under this contract will be carried by the *Contractor's* and therefore be covered under the rates tendered.

6.3.5 Covid 19

The *Contractor* shall be responsible for the health and safety of their staff on site, this means screening for medical fitness and ensuring they are provided with the required PPE, especially the COVID 19 compliant PPE as the project construction is happening during a global pandemic.

 NB: The tendered amount shall include for all costs to confirm to the Health and Safety requirements.

6.4 Environmental constraints and management

- 6.4.1 The *Contractor* shall provide a *Contractor*'s Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) addressing all the potential impacts of his activities. The *Project Manager* has the right to request additional specific work method statements should in his opinion this be required.
- 6.4.2 The *Contractor* shall identify the kinds of environmental impacts that will occur as a result of

activities and then prepare separate method statements describing how each of those impacts

will be prevented or managed so that the standards set out in this document are achieved.

method statements will be prepared in accordance with the requirements set out in the CEMP.

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To ensure that environmental issues are taken into account in the establishment of the Site offices and all other facilities on Site if required.

6.4.3 The *Contractor* shall make good all damages to the environment to the satisfaction of the *Project*

Manager's Waste Management Objective.

6.4.4 Use of cement and concrete

Cement and concrete are regarded as hazardous to the natural environment on account of the very high pH of the material, and the chemicals contained therein. The contractor shall therefor ensure that concrete is not mixed directly on the ground and that the visibility remains ofconcrete, either solid, or from washings, are physically removed immediately and disposed of as waste. Washing the visible remains into the ground will not be acceptable.

6.4.5 Noise Pollution

Equipment used on the site shall be properly muffled and maintained so as to reduce noise generation to the minimum. Working procedures shall be structured so as to avoid the unnecessary generation of noise.

6.4.6 Dust control

Dust has been identified as having a serious environmental impact. The *Contractor* is required to prevent the creation of dust.

The *Contractor* shall ensure that no dust is generated during the mixing process of construction materials used during any stage of the construction process.

6.4.7 The Contractor shall, at all times, comply with the statutes that prohibit pollution of any kind.

These statutes are enacted in the following legislation:

- National Environmental Management(Act 107 of 1998); and
- The Environmental conservation Act, 73/1989; and
- The National Water Act, 36/1998
- 6.4.8 The *Contractor* shall appoint a responsible person to ensure that no incident shall occur on site that could cause pollution. Where the *Contractor* was negligent and caused any form of pollution the damage shall be rectified at the *Contractors* cost.

6.5 Quality assurance requirements

6.5.1 The onus rests on the *Contractor* to produce work which will conform in quality and accuracy of detail to the requirements of the Specifications and Drawings, and the *Contractor* must, at his own expense, institute a quality control system and provide

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experienced technical staff together with all transport, instruments and equipment to ensure adequate supervision and positive control of the works at all times.

- 6.5.2 The *Contractor* submits his Quality Management System documents to the *Project Manager* as part of his programme under ECC Clause 31.2 to include details of:
 - Quality Plan for the contract;
 - Quality Policy
 - Index of Procedures to be used; and
 - A schedule of internal and external audits during the contract
- 6.5.3 The Contractor develops and maintains a comprehensive register of documents that will be generated throughout the contract including all quality related documents as part of its Quality Plan.
- 6.5.4 The *Project Manager* indicates those documents required to be submitted for either information, review or acceptance and the *Contractor* indicates such requirements within his register of documents. The register shall indicate the dates of issue of the documents with the *Project Manager* responding to documents submitted by the *Contractor* for review or acceptance within the *period for reply* prior to such documents being used by the *Contractor*.
- 6.5.5 The Quality Plan means the *Contractor's* statement, which outlines strategy, methodology, resources allocation, QA and Quality Control co-ordination activities to ensure that the *works* meet the standards stated in the *Works* Information.

6.6 Programming constraints

- 6.6.1 The programme, progress reports, subsequent updates, revisions and supplementary programmes as detailed in this section are an essential part of the project control system used by the *Employer* for managing the Works and in monitoring the progress of the work under the Contract. The information and data provided by the *Contractor* pursuant to this procedure must therefore be reliable, accurate and timely in presentation.
- 6.6.2 As identified in the Contract Data Part 2, a program is to be submitted with the tender. This program shall comply with the requirements as indicated in the Works Information and with specific reference 31.2 of the NEC3 Engineering Construction Contract. The program shall be submitted in both hard and soft copy forms using a computer software package accepted by the *Project Manager*. The preferred software package is Microsoft Projects subject to the prior written notification and acceptance by the *Project Manager*.
- 6.6.3 The *Contractor* shows on his Accepted Programme and all subsequently revised programmes schedules showing the critical path or paths and all necessary logic diagrams demonstrating sequence of operations.



- 6.6.4 The *Contractor*'s programme shows duration of operations in working days, the work week will be Monday's Fridays 07:30 16:00.
- 6.6.5 The *Contractor* shows on each revised programme he submits to the *Project Manager* a resource histogram showing planned progress versus actual, deviations from the Accepted Programme and any remedial actions proposed by the *Contractor*.

6.7 Contractor's management, supervision and key people

1.

- 2. 6.7.1 The *Contractor* shall provide an organogram showing his key people and their lines of authority and communication.
- 6.7.2 The Contractor shall not change the project team as detailed in the organogram submitted by the Contractor and accepted by the Project Manager without the prior written approval of the Project Manager, which approval will not unreasonably be withheld by the Project Manager
- 6.7.3 The *Works* must conform to current professional engineering practices, standards and specifications and the *works* must be completed to the satisfaction of the *Project Manager*.
- 6.7.4 The *Contractor* and his sub-contractors, if any shall have suitably qualified Supervisors in charge of the project. The names and qualifications of the Supervisors together with full details of their experience in this field of work must be furnished. The tenderer must furnish the names and addresses of all proposed sub-contractors, which is subject to approval.

6.8 Insurance provided by the Employer

- 6.8.1 Insurance provided by the *Employer* is contained in the Contract Data Part 1.
- 6.8.2 Procedures for making insurance claims can be obtained from the *Project Manager*.

6.9 Contract change management

- 6.9.1 The standard reporting forms that shall be used will be provided to the *Contractor*
- 6.9.2 No additional requirements apply to ECC Clause 60 series.

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6.10 Records of Defined Cost, payments & assessments of compensation events kept by Contractor

- 6.10.1 The *Contractor* keeps the following records available for the *Project Manager* to inspect:
 - Records of design employees location of work (if appropriate);
 - Records of Equipment used and people employed outside the Working Areas (if applicable); and
- 6.10.2 When the *Project Manager* certifies payment (see ECC Clause 51.1) following an assessment date, the *Contractor* complies with the *Employer's* procedure for invoice submission.
- 6.10.3 The invoice must correspond to the *Project Manager's* assessment of the amount due to the *Contractor* as stated in the payment certificate.
- 6.10.4 The invoice states the following:

6.11 People

6.11.1 The Contractor complies with the following PIRPMP

1.CONTRACTOR LIABILITY

1.1. The *Contractor* warrants that it will be liable to Transnet for any loss or damage caused by strikes, riots, lockouts or any labour disputes by and/or confined to the *Contractor's* employees, which loss will include any indirect or consequential damages;

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- 1.2. The *Contractor* warrants that no negotiations or feedback meetings by the *Contractor's* employees shall take place on Transnet premises, whether owned or rented by Transnet.
- 1.3. The Contractor shall give notice to Transnet of any industrial action by the Contractor's employees immediately upon becoming aware of any actual or contemplated action that is or may be carried out on Transnet's premises, whether owned or rented, and shall notify Transnet of all matters associated with such action that may potentially affect Transnet.
- 1.4. The *Contractor* is responsible for educating its employees on relevant provisions of the Labour Relations Act which deal with industrial action processes, and the risks of non-compliance.
- 1.5. The *Contractor* is required to develop a Contingency Strike Handling Plan, which plan the *Contractor* is obliged to update on a three monthly basis. The *Contractor* must provide Transnet with this plan and all updates to the Plan. The *Contractor* is responsible to communicate with its employees on site details of the plan.

2. INDUSTRIAL ACTION BY CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES

- 2.1. In the event of any industrial action by the Contractor's employees, the Contractor is required to provide competent contingency resources permitted in law to carry out any of the duties that are or could potentially be interrupted by industrial action in delivering the Service.
- 2.2. The Contractor warrants that it will compensate Transnet for any costs Transnet incurs in providing additional security to deal with any industrial action by the Contractor's employees.
- 2.3. In the event of any industrial action by the Contractor's employees, the Contractor is obliged:
 - 2.3.1. To prepare and deliver to Transnet, within two (2) hours of the commencement of industrial action an Industrial Action Report. If the industrial action persists the Contractor is required to deliver the report at 8h30 each day.
 - 2.3.2. The Industrial Action Report must provide at least the following information:
 - 2.3.2.1. Industrial incident report,
 - 2.3.2.2. Attendance register,
 - 2.3.2.3. Productivity / progress to schedule reports,
 - 2.3.2.4. Operational contingency plan,
 - 2.3.2.5. Site security report,
 - 2.3.2.6. Industrial action intelligence gathered.
 - 2.3.3. The final Industrial Action Report is to be delivered 24 hours after finalisation of the industrial action.
 - 2.3.4.The management of the Contractor is required to hold a daily industrial action teleconference with personnel identified by Transnet to discuss the industrial action, settlement of the industrial action, security issues and the impact on delivery under the contract.

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- 2.4. The resolution of any disputes or industrial action by the *Contractor*'s employees is the sole responsibility of the *Contractor*.
- 2.5. Access to Transnet premises by the Contractor and its employees is only provided for purposes of the Contractor delivering its services to Transnet. Should the Contractor and its employees not, for any reason, be capable of delivering its services Transnet is entitled to restrict or deny access onto its premises and unless otherwise authorized; such person will deemed to be trespassing.
- 6.11.2 The roles and responsibilities of the various personnel acting on behalf of the *Project Manager* with respect to IR.

6.12 Plant and Materials

- 6.12.1 All plant used by the *Contractor* on site shall be properly maintained and operated. All vehicles on public roads shall be roadworthy, with the necessary licenses, permits and safety requirements. No transporting of people in the load box of any LDV's without the correct seating and seatbelts or a Kombi may be utilized providing that it has RWC.
- 6.12.2 The Contractor provides Plant and Materials for inclusion in the works in accordance with SANS 1200A sub-paragraph 2.1, unless otherwise stated elsewhere in the Works Information provided by the Employer. All Plant and Materials are new, unless the use of old or refurbished goods and/or Materials are expressly permitted as stated elsewhere in this Works Information or as may be subsequently instructed by the Project Manager.
- 6.12.3 Where Plant and Materials for inclusion in the works originate from outside the Republic of South Africa, all such Plant and Materials are new and of merchantable quality, to a recognised national standard, with all proprietary products installed to manufacturers' instructions.
- 6.12.4 The Contractor replaces any Plant and Materials subject to breakages (whether in the Working Areas or not) or any Plant and Materials not conforming to standards or specifications stated and notifies the Project Manager and the Supervisor on each occasion where replacement is required.
- 6.12.5 Plant & Materials provided "free issue" by the *Employer*None
- 6.12.6 The *Employer* provides the following Plant and Materials for the *Contractor* to use in the *works*:
 None



6.12.7 The *Contractor* provides all other Plant and Materials necessary for the *works* not specifically stated to be provided "free issue" by the *Employer*.

6.13 Marking Plant and Materials outside the Working Areas

6.13.1 The *Contractor* prepares and marks items of Plant and Materials outside the Working Areas with the *Contractors* Logo.

6.14 Contractor's Equipment

- 6.14.1 The *Contractor* keeps daily records of his Equipment used on Site and the Working Areas (distinguishing between owned and hired Equipment) with access to such daily records available for inspection by the *Project Manager* at all reasonable times.
- 6.15.1 All equipment, scaffolding, or any other equipment necessary shall be supplied by the *Contractor*

to successfully execute the *Works* safely, to completion. All tools, test equipment, i.e. wind-speed indicators, rain meter etc. shall be supplied by the *Contractor*.

7. Procurement

a. Code of Conduct

Transnet aims to achieve the best value for money when buying or selling goods and obtaining services. - 3. Transnet's relationship with suppliers requires us to clearly define requirements, exchange information and share mutual benefits.
 - •Generally, Suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our suppliers, we will not tolerate any illegal activities. These include, but are not limited to:
 - Misrepresentation of their product (origin of manufacture, specifications, intellectual property rights, etc);
 - Collusion.
 - Failure to disclose accurate information required during the sourcing activity (ownership, financial situation, BBBEE status, etc.);
 - Corrupt activities listed above; and
 - Harassment, intimidation, or other aggressive actions towards Transnet employees.
 - Suppliers must be evaluated and approved before any materials, components, products or services are purchased from them. Rigorous due diligence is conducted, and the supplier is expected to participate in an honest and straight forward manner.

1.3. Hidden services

There are underground services that were previously erected and the as-built data to locate such services will be utilised. There are situations where the as-built data cannot be traced and, in such situations, activities must be carried out with caution. During the execution phases of the project, there is a possibility of disruption of such hidden services. These services may include conduits (oil, water and sewage), electrical cables and any other structure that may be present. The employer shall inform the contractor through a baseline risk assessment of any possibilities in anticipation.
