- 3.2 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFQ between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 3.3 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

#### 4 Legal Compliance

The successful Respondent shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable national and local laws and regulations.

#### 5 Employment Equity Act

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

#### 6 Changes to Quotations

Changes by the Respondent to its submission will not be considered after the closing date and time.

#### 7 Binding Offer

Any Quotation furnished pursuant to this Request shall be deemed to be an offer. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

#### 8 Disclaimers

- Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that Transnet reserves the right to:
  - modify the RFQ's goods / service(s) and request Respondents to re-bid on any changes;
  - reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
  - disqualify Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline;
  - not necessarily accept the lowest priced Quotation or an alternative bid;
  - place an order in connection with this Quotation at any time after the RFQ's closing date;
  - award only a portion of the proposed goods / services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ;
  - split the award of the order/s between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
  - cancel the quotation process;
  - validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is
    not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid,

#### 9 Legal review

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

#### 10 Security clearance

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the goods and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

#### 11 National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Transnet is required to ensure that price quotations are invited and accepted from prospective bidders listed on the CSD. Business may not be awarded to a respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD. The CSD can be accessed at https://secure.csd.gov.za/.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 Form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

### 12 Tax Compliance

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Respondents/ individuals who wish to submit bids.



Respondents must complete and submit <u>Annexure B</u> which include a Technical Questionnaire. A Respondent's compliance with the minimum functionality/technical threshold will be measured by their responses to Annexure B. Respondents are to note that Transnet will round off final technical scores to the nearest 2 (two) decimal places for the purposes of determining whether the technical threshold has been met.

#### 4.2 STEP FOUR: Evaluation and Final Weighted Scoring

#### 4.3 STEP FOUR: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

- Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:
  - o first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations fail,
  - o negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

#### 4.4 STEP SIX: Objective Criteria

Transnet reserves the right to award the business to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder. The objective criteria Transnet may apply in this bid process include:

- Skills Transfer and Capacity Building for Transnet;
- Impact on Transnet's Return On Investment;
- Rotation of Suppliers to promote opportunities for other suppliers, by overlooking a supplier that has been awarded business repeatedly overtime in order to benefit other suppliers in the market;
- the tenderer:
- is not under restrictions, or has principals who are under restrictions, preventing participating in the employer's procurement,
- is not undergoing a process of being restricted by Transnet or other state institution that Transnet may be aware of,
- can, as necessary and in relation to the proposed contract, demonstrate that he or she possesses the
  professional and technical qualifications, professional and technical competence, financial resources,
  equipment and other physical facilities, managerial capability, reliability, experience and reputation,
  expertise and the personnel, to perform the contract,
- has the legal capacity to enter into the contract.

- is not insolvent, in receivership, under Business Rescue as provided for in chapter 6 of the Companies Act, 2008, bankrupt or being wound up, has his affairs administered by a court or a judicial officer, has suspended his business activities, or is subject to legal proceedings in respect of any of the foregoing,
- complies with the legal requirements, if any, stated in the tender data and
- is able, in the option of the employer to perform the contract free of conflicts of interest.
- all Risks identified during a risk assessment exercise/probity check (which may be conducted by an authorised third party) that would be done to assess all risks, including but not limited to:
- the financial stability of the bidder based on key ratio analysis, which would include, but not be limited to Efficiency, Profitability, Financial Risk, Liquidity, Acid Test, and Solvency.
- a due diligence to assess functional capability and capacity. This could include a site visit.
- A commercial relationship with a Domestic Prominent Influential Person (DPIP) or Foreign Prominent Public Official (FPPO) or an entity of which such person or official is the beneficial owner; and
- Reputational and Brand risks

#### 4.5 STEP SIX: Award of business and conclusion of contract

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful or preferred bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Quotation by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s).
- Otherwise, a final contract will be concluded and entered into with the successful Bidder at the acceptance of a letter of award by the Respondent.

#### 2 Validity Period

Transnet requires a validity period of 180 [Hundred] Business Days from the closing date of this RFQ, excluding the first day and including the last day.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. However, once the adjudication body has approved the process and award of the business to the successful bidder(s), the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until a final contract has been concluded.

#### 3 Disclosure of contract information

#### Johannesburg Stock Exchange Debt Listing Requirements

Transnet may also be required to disclose information relating to the subsequent contract i.e. the name of the company, goods/services provided by the company, the value and duration of the contract, etc. in compliance with the Johannesburg Stock Exchange (JSE) Debt Listing Requirements.



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

# C2.1 PRICING ASSUMPTIONS

#### 1. The conditions of contract

#### 1.1. How goods and services are priced and assessed for payment

Clause 11 in NEC3 Supply Contract, December 2009 (SC)(with amendments April 2013) core clauses states:

Identified and defined terms	11 11.2	<ul><li>(11) The Prices are the amounts stated in the price column of the Price Schedule. Where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price Schedule, the Price is calculated by multiplying the quantity by the rate.</li><li>(12) The Price Schedule is the <i>price schedule</i> unless later changed in accordance with this contract.</li></ul>
Assessing the amount due	50.2	<ul> <li>the Price for each lump sum item in the Price Schedule which the <i>Supplier</i> has completed,</li> <li>where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price Schedule, an amount calculated by multiplying the quantity which the <i>Supplier</i> has completed by the rate,</li> <li>plus other amounts to be paid to the <i>Supplier</i>,</li> <li>less amounts to be paid by or retained from the <i>Supplier</i>.</li> </ul>

Any tax which the law requires the *Purchaser* to pay to the *Supplier* is included in the amount due.

This confirms that the Supply Contract is a priced contract where the Prices are derived from a list of items of *goods* and *service*s which can be priced as lump sums or as expected quantities of *goods* and *service*s multiplied by a rate, or a mix of both.

#### 1.2. Function of the Price Schedule

Clause 53.1 states: "Information in the Price Schedule is not Goods Information". This confirms that instructions to do work or how it is to be done are not included in the Price Schedule but in the Goods Information. This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The *Supplier* Provides the Goods and Services in accordance with the Goods Information". Hence the *Supplier* does **not** Provide the Goods and Services in accordance with the Price Schedule. The Price Schedule is only a pricing document.



### 1.3. Preparing the *price schedule*

It will be assumed that the tendering supplier has read Pages 11 and 12 and Appendix 5 of the SC Guidance Notes before preparing the *price schedule*. Items in the *price schedule* may have been inserted by the *Purchaser* and the tendering supplier should insert any additional items which he considers necessary. Whichever party provides the items in the *price schedule* the total of the Prices is assumed to be fully inclusive of everything necessary to Provide the Goods and Services as described at the time of entering into this contract.

- 1 There is no adjustment to lump sum prices in the *price schedule* if the amount, or quantity, of work within that lump sum item of *goods* or *services* later turns out to be different to that which the *Supplier* estimated at time of tender. The only basis for a change to the Prices is as a result of a compensation event. See Clause 60.1.
- 2 Hence the Prices and rates tendered by the *Supplier* in the *price schedule* are inclusive of everything necessary and incidental to Providing the Goods and Services in accordance with the Goods Information, as it was at the time of tender, as well as correct any Defects not caused by a *Purchaser's* risk.
- 3 The *Supplier* does not have to allow in his Prices and rates for matters that may arise as a result of a compensation event. It should be noted that the list of compensation events includes those arising as a result of a *Purchaser's* risk event listed in core clause 80.1.
- 4 Prices must be fixed, firm and provided as per pricing schedule.
- 5 Bidder must price for all items, and where applicable indicate where they have applied blanket pricing on the designated pricing cell.
- 6 A pricing schedule which is not fully priced will render the bidder non-responsive, hence disqualified.

#### 1.4. Format of the *price schedule*

(From Appendix 5 on page 78 of the SC Guidance Notes)

Entries in the first four columns in the *price schedule* in section C2.2 are made either by the *Purchaser* or the tendering supplier.

If the *Supplier* is to be paid an amount for the item which is not adjusted if the quantity of work in the item changes, the tendering supplier enters the amount in the Price column only, the Unit, Quantity and Rate columns being left blank.

If the *Supplier* is to be paid an amount for the item which is the rate for the item multiplied by the quantity completed, the tendering *Supplier* enters the rate which is then multiplied by the Quantity to produce the Price, which is also entered.



If the *Supplier* is to be paid an amount for an item proportional to the length of time for which the *goods* and *service*s are provided, a unit of time is stated in the Unit column and the length of time (as a quantity of the stated units of time) is stated in the Quantity column.
