Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. 10 **DISCLAIMERS**

- 10.1 Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:
- 10.2 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;

- 10.4 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, as may be explicitly articulated in the conditions or objective criteria to this RFP;
- 10.5 cancel the bid process;
- 10.6 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;
- 10.7 request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;

SECTION 3: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) entered into standardized Industry wide individual 10 - year contracts with Coal Export Parties (CEPs) for the export of Coal through the Richards Bay Coal Terminal (RBCT).

The export coal contracts, and its supporting Service Level Agreements (SLA) requires that an equity auditor must be appointed. The envisaged purpose of the appointment is to have an appointed external and independent expert who can validate TFRs application of the equity system and make recommendation for any corrections. This with the view to ensuring that principles of fair and equitable sharing of available capacity, in line with each CEPs contracted tonnages, are observed by TFR.

The North Corridor has over the lay five years experienced challenges beyond management control, e.g., COVID19 Lockdowns, Cable theft, Vandalism, Loco in-service failures, CRRC Locomotive issues, etc. which all led to the Corridor executed export coal volume reducing from +76mt per annum in 2015/16 to +48mt by 2023/24. TFR subsequently reduced the Corridor declared Capacity from 81mt to 60mt per annum in order to account for constraints in the system. As a result, there is a stringent focus by CEPs on the equity process as it ensures that each party gets their equitable share of the constrained capacity.

2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Whereas Transnet is seeking a partner(s) to provide solutions for its security services in the North Corridor, it also seeks to improve its current processes for providing these Services to its end user community throughout its locations.

The selected Consultant(s) must share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met by meeting contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Supplier/Consultant(s) will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partnership will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service and profitability.

Specifically, Transnet seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- 2.1 Transnet must receive reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Consultant's economies of scale and streamlined service processes.
- 2.2 Transnet must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both Transnet and the chosen Consultant(s).
- 2.3 Transnet must receive proactive improvements from the Consultant with respect to provision of Services and related processes.
- 2.4 Transnet's overall competitive advantage must be strengthened by the chosen Consultant's leading edge technology and service delivery systems.

- 2.5 Transnet end users must be able to rely on the chosen Consultant's personnel for service enquiries, recommendations and substitutions.
- 2.6 Transnet must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Services, including managed service processes on a Group basis.

3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

As envisaged in the SLA between Transnet and CEPs an Equity Auditor must be an independent accounting and auditing firm or rail engineering consultancy.

All Technical specifications of the Equity Audit are governed by clauses 10 and 11 of the SLA between TFR and CEPs for the RCBT Coal Export agreements and have been highlighted in the cope section of this document.

3.1 Detailed technical specification requirements are outlined below.

The purpose of this specification is to outline the services to be sourced and putting together a sustainable solution for the audit of the equity process applied by TFR on Export Coal to RBCT.

3.1.1 Introduction

The audit of the Equity process is mandated by the RBCT Agreements (and supporting SLAs) in order to ensure equity application of the equity system by TFR for the export of Coal through RBCT. The equity Auditor, as prescribed by the SLA, may also be required to conduct specific audits in instances where there are disputes in the numbers between TFR and its CEPs.

3.1.2 **Scope**

The scope of work entails the provision of equity audit services for coal exports through the RBCT Terminal in line with Export Coal Contracts.

The services include the following:

- 3.1.2.1 The following to be included as the scope and requirements of activities to be performed by the equity auditor.
 - a. The Equity Auditor shall be required to undertake an audit of the manner in which TFR has applied and given effect to the Equity System.
 - The Equity Auditor shall conduct their audit duties within the prescript of the applicable audit regulations.

- c. The Equity Auditor shall be entitled to call for any books, records, information and other data deemed necessary by the Equity Auditor.
- d. Within 15 (fifteen) Business Days, following the submission of any written submissions, the Equity Auditor shall be required to submit a written report to TFR (the "Equity Audit Report") detailing inter alia the steps and processes followed by the Equity Auditor in undertaking the audit, the aspects that were reviewed and audited and any and all findings, determinations and conclusions including its findings and determinations in respect of any queries as well as binding recommendations as to the corrective measures to be taken by TFR, provided that the Equity Audit Report shall not disclose the names, contracted tonnages or other sensitive commercial information of the Coal Exporters whose queries were considered nor the Coal Exporters who benefitted from or were prejudiced as a result of any incorrect application of the Equity.
- e. In undertaking the audit and in making any and all findings and determinations the Equity Auditor shall act as an expert and not as an arbitrator.
- f. Obtain a listing of all coal exporters who are party to the Service Level Agreement for the Transportation of Coal to the Richards Bay Coal Terminal by Transnet SOC Limited, acting through its Transnet Freight Rail Division (TFR).
- g. Read through and summarize all agreements to ensure that they are consistent and contain the same terms regarding the application of the equity system.
- Make enquiries from TFR management to determine the process followed to compile the equity system report on a weekly basis. This will include obtaining a detailed understanding of the following:
 - Determination of the weekly capacity available,
 - Preparation of the proposed weekly allocation across the coal exporters
 - Process of communicating proposed weekly allocations to the coal exporters, including the procedures which are followed in the following circumstances:
 - Declined transport services
 - Cancellation of trains by the coal exporter
 - Cancellation of trains by the Richards Bay Coal Terminal (RBCT)
 - Trains loaded but not yet un-loaded at RBCT

- Reallocation of the proposed weekly capacity due to Coal Exporter not requiring transport services
- Method of communication between the Coal Exporter and TFR and the relevant approval processes which are required to be followed, if any
- Process of logging disputes by the Coal Exporter
- Based on the enquiries made of TFR management a detailed flow of transactions will be documented. This process is also expected to identify potential weaknesses in the control environment and provide suggestions to management where controls are not effectively designed.



Transnet will utilise the following methodology and criteria in selecting a preferred Consultant:

However, in order to expedite the process, Transnet reserves the right to conduct the different steps of the evaluation process in parallel. In such instances the evaluation of bidders at any given stage must not be interpreted to mean that bidders have necessarily passed any previous stage(s).

6.1 STEP ONE: Test for Administrative Responsiveness

The test for administrative responsiveness will include the following:

Repondents must refer to <u>Annexure A</u> which include the Technical Scoring matrix. A Respondent's compliance with the minimum functionality/technical threshold will be measured by their responses.

Respondents are to note that Transnet will round off final technical scores to the nearest 2 (two) decimal places for the purposes of determining whether the technical threshold has been met.

The minimum threshold for technical/functionality [Step Two] must be met or exceeded for a Respondent's Proposal to progress to Step Three for final evaluation

6.3 STEP THREE: Evaluation and Final Weighted Scoring

6.5 STEP FOUR: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market-related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:

- first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations
- negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

STEP FIVE: Award of business and conclusion of contract 6.6

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Bid by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s). where applicable.
