#### 3 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

Transnet has implemented a new electronic tender submission system, the e-Tender Submission Portal, in line with the overall Transnet digitalization strategy where suppliers can view advertised tenders, register their information, log their intent to respond to bids and upload their bid proposals/responses on to the system.

- a) The Transnet e-Tender Submission Portal can be accessed as follows:
  - a) Log on to the Transnet eTenders management platform website/ Portal (transnetetenders.azurewebsites.net)
  - b) Click on "ADVERTISED TENDERS" to view advertised tenders;

In other words, each bidder must register the intent to bid and submit its bid through its own profile under the same company name that will eventually bid for the tender. No company shall submit a bid on behalf of another company regardless of the company being a subsidiary or holding company.
- I) In case of a Joint Venture, any of the parties/companies to the Joint Venture may use its registered profile to submit a bid on behalf of the Joint Venture.

#### 4 RFP INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Please sign documents [sign, stamp and date the bottom of each page] before uploading them on the system. The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the respondent to do so.
- 4.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 5] must be returned with proposals.
- 4.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 4.4 Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to clause 15 [Alterations made by the Respondent to Bid Prices] of the General Bid Conditions, paragraph 12 below (Legal Review) and Section 6 of the RFP, alterations, additions or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

### 5 JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If at the time of the bid submission such a JV or consortium agreement has not been concluded, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note that for the purpose of Evaluation, a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card (a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate) Preference points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the specific goals requirements in accordance with the table indicated in Section 4.1 of the specific goals Claim Form.

- 6.5 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 6.6 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- 6.7 Transnet will publish the outcome of this RFP in the National Treasury e-tender portal and Transnet website with 10 days after the award has been finalised. Respondents are required to check the National Treasury e-tender Portal and Transnet website for the results of the tender process. All unsuccessful bidders have a right to request Transnet to furnish reasons for their bid not being successful. This requested must be directed to the contact person stated in the SBD 1 form

#### **7 CONFIDENTIALITY**

All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information related to this RFP or the subsequent contract, written approval must be obtained from Transnet.

### 8 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the [**Service provider**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

#### 9 EMPLOYMENT EQUITY ACT

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

## 10 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 10.1 modify the RFP's Goods/Services;
- 10.2 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 10.3 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;

- 10.4 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, as may be explicitly articulated in the conditions or objective criteria to this RFP;
- 10.5 cancel the bid process;
- 10.6 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;
- 10.7 request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;

## **SECTION 3: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS**

#### 1 BACKGROUND

The Transnet board of directors approved the establishment of the DMTN programme for the issuance of notes up to the programme size of R80 billion. The DMTN programme has been listed on the Johannesburg Stock Exchange ("JSE"). Under the DMTN programme, Transnet may issue notes to be listed or unlisted notes. Notes may be listed on the JSE or another financial exchange. The proceeds may be utilized for general corporate uses or any other purpose which is stated in the applicable pricing supplement.

#### 2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Transnet seeks to appoint a financial institution to act as lead arranger and transaction advisor for specific issuances under Transnet's R80 billion domestic medium-term note ("DMTN") programme for a period of 36 months.

Transnet has compiled the annual corporate plan for the 2024/25 financial year which incorporates funding requirements for the next five years. In accordance with Transnet Turnaround Plan and Transnet Funding Plan, bond issuance under the Transnet Domestic Medium-Term Programme is expected to contribute to the funding requirement in the next five years. As a result, Transnet is seeking to appoint an external party/es to provide the services of the arranger for the domestic market issuances over the next three years. Therefore, Transnet wishes to appoint a lead arranger(s) and transaction advisor(s) with expertise to advise on and assist with the issuance of notes to be listed on the JSE and/or unlisted notes through STRATE as part of the funding requirements over the next three years.

The selected Service provider must share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met by meeting contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation, and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Service provider will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partnership will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service, and profitability.

## 3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

The main objective of the mandated lead arranger and transaction advisor will be to assist Transnet to raise part of 2026, 2027 and 2028 financial year's funding requirements through the issuance of bonds under the DMTN ("Proposed Transactions"). Part of this function will be to arrange for and take Transnet's executives on a road show to interact with a focused investor base.

A further objective will be to consider the most suitable instrument type under the DMTN considering the macro-economic and debt capital markets environment.

The lead arranger and transaction advisor will be required to provide guidance on issue size and pricing before any issuances are considered.

#### **Expected outputs:**

- a. Promote the issuances under the Proposed Transactions with the suitable investor base;
- b. Arrange domestic roadshows;
- c. Assist in the preparation of the roadshow schedule and the materials;
- d. Arrange meetings with specific investors;
- e. Guide on the:
  - type of instrument
  - timing of the issuance;
  - maturity;
  - size; and
  - issuance pricing;
- f. Recommend funding instrument type;
- g. Coordinate the auctions and the bookbuild process for the Proposed Transactions;
- h. Following the auction or bookbuild process, assist with the allocation process and listing of the issuance(s) on the Johannesburg Stock Exchange;
- i. Provide such other services as may be agreed to in writing or reasonably required to achieve the successful completion of the Proposed Transactions; and
- j. General role as mandated lead arranger and transaction advisor.

#### **Performance Management on DMTN:**

- · Successful execution of at least R32 billion over the 36-month period;


